Bid submittal date and location

Bids should be typed or submitted in ink and returned in a sealed container marked on the outside with the BL# and Company Name. Bids will be received until **2:50 P.M. local time on April 30, 2026** at the Gwinnett County Purchasing Division, 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30046. Any bid received after this date and time will not be accepted. Bids will be publicly opened and read at 3:00 P.M. Apparent bid results will be available the following business day on our website www.gwinnettcounty.com.

Pre-Bid Conference

A **pre-bid conference** is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on **April 9, 2026** at the Gwinnett County Rhodes Jordan Park Aquatic Center, located at 100 E. Crogan Street, Lawrenceville, GA 30046. All contractors are urged to attend.

Project Description

The successful contractor shall furnish all labor and materials required to replace existing water line and surrounding tile and prepare pool shell for plaster at one aquatic center (one instructional pool, one competition pool, and one outdoor leisure pool). Existing pools shell must be prepared to receive a new conventional plaster finish.

Bonding and Insurance

All contractors must submit with bid, a bid bond, certified check or cashier's check in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total bid. **Failure to submit a bid bond with the proper rating will result in the bid being deemed non-responsive.** Successful contractor will be required to meet insurance requirements, submit a one hundred percent (100%) performance bond and a one hundred percent (100%) payment bond. Insurance and Bonding Company should be licensed to do business by the Georgia Secretary of State, authorized to do business in Georgia by The Georgia Insurance Department, listed in the Department of Treasury's Publication of Companies holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Surety on Federal Bonds and as acceptable reinsuring companies. **The bid bond, payment bond, and performance bond must have an A.M. Best rating of A-7 or higher.**

POOL PLASTERING AND TILE REPLACEMENT SPECIFICATIONS

BASE BID: The successful contractor shall furnish all labor and materials required to replace existing water line and surrounding tile and prepare pool shell for plaster at two aquatic centers. Existing pools shell must be prepared to receive a new conventional plaster finish. The pools are located at:

I. SCOPE OF WORK – RHODES JORDAN AQUATIC CENTER

The scope of work includes but is not limited to the following:

1. All work listed in the project at Rhodes Jordan Aquatic Center SHALL be completed by October 17th, 2026.
2. Contractor shall familiarize themselves with site conditions at each location prior to submitting their bid.
3. Prior to work beginning, the County Representative will drain the pool.
4. Contractor shall remove and protect all handrails, drains, inlets, and other any county property that will be in the work area prior to work beginning.
5. Contractor shall cover all drains, inlets, and other non-removable county property to protect them from damage.
6. Contractor shall adequately protect County property and take necessary precautions during the work process to protect all persons and property from damage or loss. Reports of any damage to County property must be submitted by contractor to the designated County Representative. Damage to public and/or private property shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor and shall be repaired and/or replaced at no additional cost to the satisfactions of Gwinnett County.
7. The contractor shall complete all work according to manufacturer's specifications.
8. Contractor is responsible for removing ALL construction debris and disposing of it off premises according to all Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations.
9. Contractor shall chip or saw cut all existing plaster for 100% removal of existing plaster.
10. Contractor shall remove all existing tile and grout.

11. Contractor shall remove existing sealant from all expansion joints.
12. V-cut all cracks back by saw cutting to structure soundness and repairing with epoxy sealer or an approved alternate.
13. Contractor shall prepare pool to receive new conventional plaster finish.
14. Contractor shall apply Scratch Kote 2000 bond coat or approved alternative.
15. Contractor shall install new tile and grout in the same location as previous tile was removed.
16. Contractor shall update and replace No Diving and Depth Marker Tiles as needed to be code compliant (Materials provided by the county as needed).
17. Contractor shall apply new sealant in all expansion joints and allow curing for 72 hours.
18. Contractor shall provide a conventional white marble plaster to the pool structure.
19. Contractor shall replace all drains and inlets with VGB compliant drains and inlets. (Materials provided by the county as needed)
20. Contractor shall replace all Hydrostatic Relief Valves (Materials provided by the county as needed).
21. Contractor shall ensure all sump box covers are level with new plaster and any excess plaster that is in the sump box is removed.
22. The new pool surface shall be fully cured prior to refilling the pool, unless County Representative approved filling during curing of new plaster.
23. The contractor will notify the County Representative the day before the pool is expected to be refilled.
24. The contractor shall balance pool chemistry after the pool is filled for 14 days with chemicals provided by the county representative.
25. The contractor shall brush the new plaster for 14 days after the pool is filled during times scheduled with the County Representative.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Contractor shall submit tile, grout, and plaster samples for color selection by County Representative.

1. Materials

A. Setting and Grout Materials

- a. Thin set shall be of a type approved for use underwater in pool applications.
- b. Grout shall be of a type approved for use underwater and in pool application.
 - i. Grout color sample is required for approval by the county representative.

B. Plaster Materials

- a. Deliver manufactured materials to site in manufacturers' original unbroken packages or containers bearing manufacturer's name and brand labels. Keep cementitious materials dry until ready to be used and stored off the ground, under cover and away from damp surfaces.
- b. Apply plaster in swimming pool only when ambient temperature is above 40 degrees F and protect applied plaster from rapid drying by sun or wind until curing is completed or pool is filled with water. Confirm and comply with all applicable manufacturer's installation requirements.
- c. Portland cement, ASTM C150, type I white or approved alternate.
- d. Hydrated Lime, ASTM C206, type S, or approved alternate.
- e. White marble aggregates for conventional pool plaster finish coat uniformly graded within following limits, all passing the no. 30 sieve (percentage retained by weight plus or minus 2% on each sieve):

No. 30	0	0
No. 50	25	50
No. 100	75	90
No. 200	90	100

- f. Water, clean, fresh, from domestic potable source.
- g. Since conventional pool plaster finish is to be used, use an approved bonding admix, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendation.

2. Proportions and Mixing:

- a. Materials are specified on a volume basis and shall be measured in approved containers which will ensure that the specified proportions will be controlled and accurately maintained during the progress of the work. Measuring materials with shovels ("shovel count") is not permitted.
- b. Conventional White Marble Pool Plaster Finish Coat: Mix finish in proportion of one part by volume of white Portland cement to not more than two parts by volume of aggregates (specified white marble dust).
- c. Perform mixing in approved mechanical mixers of the type in which quantity of water can be controlled accurately and uniformly. While mixer is in continuous operation, add approximately 90% of estimated quantity of water, half of sand, all cement, and the other one-half of the sand into mixer in that sequence and mix thoroughly with remainder of water until mixture is uniform in color and consistency. Avoid excess mixing to prevent hasty solution of cement resulting in accelerated set. Do not use any caked or lump materials. Completely empty mixer and mixing boxes after each batch is mixed and keep free of old plaster.

3. Execution

A. Tile Preparation

1. Remove all waterline tile and prepare to retile with new materials.

2. Remove all skimmer throat tile and prepare to retile with new material.
3. Remove all underwater lane tile and prepare to retile with new material.
4. Remove all white plastic expansion strips around the top of waterline tile.
5. Remove all stair and bench tile and prepare to replace with one strip of tile on top of stair and bench.

B. Plaster Preparation

1. Sawcut a ½" deep cut under the existing waterline tile and chip out at a 45-degree angle to allow full plaster thickness at tile.
2. Sawcut and chip out around floor inlets, wall inlets, and any other penetrations to maintain full plaster thickness in all areas.
3. Sawcut and chip out 100% of plaster.
4. Bond coat all surfaces using Scratch Kote 2000 or approved alternate.

C. Tile Installation

1. Install waterline tile using approved 1"x1" or 2"x2" tile around the entire perimeter of the pool and the interior of all skimmer throats.
2. Before grouting tile install a ¼" to 3/8" caulk joint between the top row of tile and the underside of the pool coping.
 - a. Caulking used should be the same material as specified for the deck joints. Color to be approved by the County Representative.
3. Used finished one edge tile at all edges and transitions.
4. Install a single strip of tile on top at all steps and bench edges.
5. Grout all tile with a sanded, acid resistant grout, that is approved for use in pools and underwater.

D. Plaster Installation

1. Preparation of Surfaces and Bond Coat:

Clean base surfaces of projections, dust, loose particles, grease, bond breakers, and foreign matter; make sufficiently rough to provide a strong mechanical bond. Wash entire concrete pool shell with acidic solution within 24 hours of plastering. Do not apply plaster directly to the surfaces of masonry or concrete that is coated with any acidic solution compound or similar agent until compound or agent is completely removed by water blasting. Thoroughly wash entire surface with 2,000 psi high pressure water immediately prior to plastering. Wet cementitious base surfaces with a fine fog water spray to produce a uniformly moist condition and check screeds, pool equipment, and accessories for correct alignment before plastering is started. Do not apply plaster to base surfaces containing frost. Install temporary coverings as required to protect adjoining surfaces from staining or damage by plastering operations.

Scrub bond coat into the prepared concrete surface immediately prior plastering. Use stiff bristle brush to ensure total coverage and penetration of the bond coat slurry.

2. Application of Plaster:

Confirm all application requirements with the manufacturer. Apply finish plaster to the properly prepared substrate at the minimum thickness required by the manufacturer, but no less than 3/8-inch thickness at any location. Apply finish plaster by hand or machine. If plastering machine is used, control fluidity of plaster to have a slump not exceeding 2 – ½ inches when tested using a 2" by 4" by 6" high slump cone. Do not add additional water to the mix subsequent to determining water content to meet this slump. Perform slump test according to following procedure:

- a. Place cone on level, dry non-absorptive base plate.
- b. While holding cone firmly against base plate, fill cone with plaster taken directly from hose or nozzle of plastering machine, tamping with a metal rod during filling to release all air bubbles.
- c. Screed off plaster level with top of cone. Remove cone by lifting it straight up with a slow and smooth motion.
- d. Place cone in a vertical position adjacent to freed plaster sample using care not to jiggle base plate.
- e. Lay straightedge across top of cone; measure slump in inches from bottom edge of straightedge to the top of slumped plaster sample.

3. Workmanship:

Unless otherwise required by the manufacturer, apply finish plaster in two coats by "double-back" method with second coat applied as soon as first coat is tamped and initially floated. Apply plaster with a sufficient pressure to provide a good bond on bases. Work plaster to screeds at intervals of from 5 feet to 8 feet on straight surfaces. Apply smooth trowel finish without waves, cracks, trowel marks, ridges, pits, crazing, discoloration, projections, or other imperfections. Form plaster carefully around curves and angles, well up to screeds. Take special care to prevent sagging and consequent drooping of applications. Produce surfaces free of visible junction marks in finish coat where one day's work adjoins another. Finish proprietary plaster as required by manufacturer.

4. Curing:

Curing plaster with fine fog water spray applied to finish coat as frequently as required to prevent dry-out of plaster. Keep plaster damp until pool is filled. Prevent damage or staining of plaster by troweling or curing.

5. Patching, Pointing and Cleaning Up:

Upon completion, cut out and patch loose, cracked, damaged or defective plaster; patches matching existing plaster in texture, color, and finish, flush with adjoining plaster. Perform pointing and patching of surfaces and plasterwork abutting or adjoining any other finish work in a neat and workmanlike manner. If 10% or more of the pool plaster finish is found to be defective, the plaster shall be removed and replaced complete from all surfaces. Remove plaster dropping or spattering from all surfaces, have in clean unblemished condition ready for pool filling. Remove protective coverings from adjoining surfaces. Remove debris from site.

B. Caulking / Sealant

All removal and install of caulking and sealant shall be done per manufacturers specifications.

1. Caulking shall be done everywhere it is already existing and as needed to professional standards. For Example:
 - a. Construction joints.
 - b. Concrete deck to tile joints.
 - c. Pool coping joints.
 - d. Pool gutter to concrete deck joints.
 - e. Pool plaster to tile joints.
 - f. Control and expansion joints.
 - g. Joints between different materials.
 - h. Other joints as indicated.
2. Performance Criteria of caulks and sealants.
 - a. Provide and install joint sealants that establish and maintain watertight and airtight joint seals without staining or deteriorating joint substrates.
 - b. Provide manufacturers product data for each type of sealant for proposed use.
 - c. Provide product data certifying compatibility and adhesion test reports from the manufacturer indicating materials forming joint substrates and joint-sealing backings have been tested for compatibility and adhesion with sealant; include any test results and recommendations for primers and substrate preparation needed for adhesion.
 - d. Provide product manufacturers warranty.
3. Project Conditions
 - a. Do not proceed with installation of joint sealant under the following conditions: when ambient and substrate temperature conditions are outside the limits permitted by the product manufacturer's tolerances or below 40 degrees F.; when substrates are wet; or when joint contaminants capable of interfering with adhesion have not yet been removed from joint substrates.
 - b. Compatibility: provide joint sealants, backing, and other related materials that are compatible with one another and joint substrates under conditions of service and application as demonstrated by sealant manufacturer, based on testing and field results.
 - c. Prepare each joint, by removal of existing joint material and or all debris in joint, meeting the product manufacturer's preparation requirements. Notify the County representative of any extreme conditions that may require additional direction or instruction from the County representative.
 - d. Contractor shall be responsible for protection of all adjacent and or facility improvements. Any damages shall be repaired and or replaced per County's requirements without additional cost. The contractor shall keep the facility locked at all times. The contractor is responsible for proper and safe storage of all materials and equipment. The contractor is responsible for protection of all work in progress until final acceptance.
4. Products
 - a. Provide complete manufacturer's datasheet on each product and identify its proposed use to the County Representative.

- b. Color of exposed joint sealant must be approved by County Representative.
 - c. Products include but are not limited to, Deck-O-Seal and Sika NP1.
 - d. Cylindrical sealant backings: proposed type to be compatible with sealant and sized correctly for the application. Contributing to optimum sealant performance.
 - e. Primer: Material recommended by joint sealant manufacturer is to be used where required by manufacturers specifications.
 - f. Cleaner: Chemical cleaner acceptable to the manufacturer of sealants and backing material, free of oily residues or other substances capable of staining or harming joint substrates and adjacent surfaces in any way and formulated to promote optimum adhesion of sealants to joints and joint substrates.
5. Execution
- a. Examine joints indicated to receive joint sealants with the County representative, for compliance with requirements for configuration, installation tolerances, and other conditions affecting joint sealant performance.
 - b. Comply with the manufacturer's written installation instructions for product and applications indicated, unless more stringent requirements apply.
 - c. Comply with recommendations in ASTM C 1193 for use of joint sealant as applicable to materials, applications, and conditions indicated.
 - d. Clean out and dry all joints immediately before installing joint sealant to comply with manufacturer's written instructions; removing all foreign material from joint substrates that could interfere with adhesion of joint sealant including dust, dirt, old joint sealant material, back rod, oils, grease, loose grout or plaster material, etc.
 - e. Clean porous substrate surfaces by brushing, grinding, cutting, mechanical abrading, and or a combination of these methods to produce a clean, sound substrate capable of developing an optimum bond with joint sealant. Remove loose particles by vacuuming or blowing out joints with oil-free compressed air.
 - f. Prime joint substrates where recommended in writing by joint sealant manufacturer. Apply primer to comply with manufacturer's written instructions. Confine primers to areas of joint-sealer bond; do not allow spillage or migration onto adjoining surfaces.
 - g. Install sealant back rod as needed to support sealants during application and at position required to produce cross-sectional shapes and depths of installed sealants relative to joint widths that allow optimum sealant movement and capability. Do not leave gaps between ends of sealant backing. Do not stretch, twist, tear, or puncture sealant backing. Remove sealant backings that have become wet before sealant application and replace with new dry material.
 - h. Install sealant using proven techniques. Place sealants so they directly contact and fully wet joints and substrates. Completely fill in recesses in each joint configuration. Produce uniform, cross-sectional shapes, depths, relative to joint widths that allow optimum sealant movement capability.
 - i. Immediately after sealant application and before "skinning" or curing begins, tool sealant according to requirements specified to form a smooth, uniform configuration; to eliminate air pockets, and to ensure contact and adhesion of sealant with sides of joints. Remove excess sealant from surfaces of joints. Use tooling agents that are approved by the sealant manufacturer that do not discolor sealant or adjacent surfaces.

- j. Clean off excess sealant or sealant smears adjacent to joints as the work progresses and with cleaning materials recommended in writing by the product manufacturer.
- k. Protect joint sealants during and after curing period from contact with contaminating substances and from damage resulting from other activity, operations, or causes so sealants are without deterioration or damage at the time of acceptance by the County representative. If damage or deterioration occurs, despite such protection, cut out and remove damaged joint sealant immediately and install replacement/repair areas in that are indistinguishable from original work.

1. All work listed in the project at Dacula Park Pool SHALL be completed after September 14, 2026.
2. Contractor shall familiarize themselves with site conditions at each location prior to submitting their bid.
3. Prior to work beginning, the County Representative will drain the pool.
4. Contractor shall remove and protect all handrails, drains, inlets, and other any county property that will be in the work area prior to work beginning.
5. Contractor shall cover all drains, inlets, and other non-removable county property to protect them from damage.
6. Contractor shall adequately protect County property and take necessary precautions during the work process to protect all persons and property from damage or loss. Reports of any damage to County property must be submitted by contractor to the designated County Representative. Damage to public and/or private property shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor and shall be repaired and/or replaced at no additional cost to the satisfactions of Gwinnett County.
7. The contractor shall complete all work according to manufacturer's specifications.
8. Contractor is responsible for removing ALL construction debris and disposing of it off premises according to all Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations.
9. Contractor shall chip or saw cut all around all fittings, lights, tile, drains and under the existing waterline tile to allow full plaster thickness on the edges.
10. Contractor shall inspect entire pool shell and remove any hollow spots found.
11. Contractor shall repair or replace any missing or damaged tile or grout.
12. Contractor shall deep clean all existing tile and grout after plaster project completion.
13. Contractor shall remove existing sealant from all expansion joints.
14. V-cut all cracks back by saw cutting to structure soundness and repairing with epoxy sealer or an approved alternate.
15. Contractor shall prepare pool to receive new conventional plaster finish.
16. Contractor shall apply Scratch Kote 2000 bond coat or approved alternative.
17. Contractor shall install new tile and grout in the same location as previous tile was removed.

18. Contractor shall update and replace No Diving and Depth Marker Tiles as needed to be code compliant. (Materials provided by the county as needed)
19. Contractor shall apply new sealant in all expansion joints and allow curing for 72 hours.
20. Contractor shall provide a conventional white marble plaster to the pool structure.
21. Contractor shall replace all drains and inlets with VGB compliant drains and inlets. (Materials provided by the county as needed)

Clean base surfaces of projections, dust, loose particles, grease, bond breakers, and foreign matter; make sufficiently rough to provide a strong mechanical bond.

Wash entire concrete pool shell with acidic solution within 24 hours of plastering. Do not apply plaster directly to the surfaces of masonry or concrete that is coated with any acidic solution compound or similar agent until compound or agent is completely removed by water blasting. Thoroughly wash entire surface with 2,000 psi high pressure water immediately prior to plastering. Wet cementitious base surfaces with a fine fog water spray to produce a uniformly moist condition and check screeds, pool equipment, and accessories for correct alignment before plastering is started. Do not apply plaster to base surfaces containing frost. Install temporary coverings as required to protect adjoining surfaces from staining or damage by plastering operations.

Scrub bond coat into the prepared concrete surface immediately prior plastering. Use stiff bristle brush to ensure total coverage and penetration of the bond coat slurry.

2. Application of Plaster:

Confirm all application requirements with the manufacturer. Apply finish plaster to the properly prepared substrate at the minimum thickness required by the manufacturer, but no less than 3/8-inch thickness at any location. Apply finish plaster by hand or machine. If plastering machine is used, control fluidity of plaster to have a slump not exceeding 2 – ½ inches when tested using a 2" by 4" by 6" high slump cone. Do not add additional water to the mix subsequent to determining water content to meet this slump. Perform slump test according to following procedure:

- a. Place cone on level, dry non-absorptive base plate.
- b. While holding cone firmly against base plate, fill cone with plaster taken directly from hose or nozzle of plastering machine, tamping with a metal rod during filling to release all air bubbles.
- c. Screed off plaster level with top of cone. Remove cone by lifting it straight up with a slow and smooth motion.
- d. Place cone in a vertical position adjacent to freed plaster sample using care not to jiggle base plate.
- e. Lay straightedge across top of cone; measure slump in inches from bottom edge of straightedge to the top of slumped plaster sample.

3. Workmanship:

Unless otherwise required by the manufacturer, apply finish plaster in two coats by "double-back" method with second coat applied as soon as first coat is tamped and initially floated. Apply plaster with a sufficient pressure to provide a good bond on bases. Work plaster to screeds at intervals of from 5 feet to 8 feet on straight surfaces. Apply smooth trowel finish without waves, cracks, trowel marks, ridges, pits, crazing, discoloration, projections, or other imperfections. Form plaster carefully around curves and angles, well up to screeds. Take special care to prevent sagging and consequent drooping of applications. Produce surfaces free of visible junction marks in finish coat where one day's work adjoins another. Finish proprietary plaster as required by manufacturer.

4. Patching, Pointing and Cleaning Up

Upon completion, cut out and patch loose, cracked, damaged or defective plaster; patches matching existing plaster in texture, color, and finish, flush with adjoining plaster. Perform pointing and patching of surfaces and plasterwork abutting or

adjoining any other finish work in a neat and workmanlike manner. If 10% or more of the pool plaster finish is found to be defective, the plaster shall be removed and replaced complete form all surfaces. Remove plaster dropping or spattering from all surfaces, have in clean unblemished condition ready for pool filling. Remove protective coverings from adjoining surfaces. Remove debris from site.

E. Caulking/Sealant

All removal and installation of caulking and sealant shall be done per manufacturers specifications.

1. Caulking shall be done everywhere it is already existing and as needed to professional standards. For example:
 - a. Construction joints
 - b. Concrete deck to tile joints
 - c. Pool coping joints
 - d. Pool gutter to concrete deck joints.
 - e. Pool plaster to tile joints.
 - f. Control and expansion joints.
 - g. Joints between different materials.
 - h. Other joints as indicated.
2. Performance Criteria of caulks and sealants.
 - a. Provide and install joint sealants that establish and maintain watertight and airtight joint seals without staining or deteriorating joint substrates.
 - b. Provide manufacturers product datasheet for each type of sealant for proposed use.
 - c. Provide product datasheet certifying compatibility and adhesion test reports from the manufacturer indicating materials forming joint substrates and joint-sealing backings have been tested for compatibility and adhesion with sealant; include any test results and recommendations for primers and substrate preparation needed for adhesion.
 - d. Provide product manufacturers warranty.
3. Project Conditions
 - a. Do not proceed with installation of joint sealant under the following conditions: when ambient and substrate temperature conditions are outside the limits permitted by the product manufacturer's tolerances or below 40 degrees F.; when substrates are wet; or when joint contaminants capable of interfering with adhesion have not yet been removed from joint substrates.
 - b. Compatibility: provide joint sealants, backing, and other related materials that are compatible with one another and joint substrates under conditions of service and application as demonstrated by sealant manufacturer, based on testing and field results.
 - c. Prepare each joint, by removal of existing joint material and or all debris in joint, meeting the product manufacturer's preparation requirements. Notify the County representative of any extreme conditions that may require additional direction or instruction from the County representative.

- d. Contractor shall be responsible for protection of all adjacent and or facility improvements. Any damages shall be repaired and or replaced per County's requirements without additional cost. The contractor shall keep the facility locked at all times. The contractor is responsible for proper and safe storage of all materials and equipment. The contractor is responsible for protection of all work in progress until final acceptance.

4. Products

- a. Provide complete manufacturer's datasheet on each product and identify its proposed use to the County Representative.
- b. Color of exposed joint sealant must be approved by County Representative.
- c. Products include but are not limited to, Deck-O-Seal and Sika NP1.
- d. Cylindrical sealant backings: proposed type to be compatible with sealant and sized correctly for the application. Contributing to optimum sealant performance.
- e. Primer: Material recommended by joint sealant manufacturer is to be used where required by manufacturers specifications.
- f. Cleaner: Chemical cleaner acceptable to the manufacturer of sealants and backing material, free of oily residues or other substances capable of staining or harming joint substrates and adjacent surfaces in any way and formulated to promote optimum adhesion of sealants to joints and joint substrates.

5. Execution

- a. Examine joints indicated to receive joint sealants with the County representative, for compliance with requirements for configuration, installation tolerances, and other conditions affecting joint sealant performance.
- b. Comply with the manufacturer's written installation instructions for product and applications indicated, unless more stringent requirements apply.
- c. Comply with recommendations in ASTM C 1193 for use of joint sealant as applicable to materials, applications, and conditions indicated.
- d. Clean out and dry all joints immediately before installing joint sealant to comply with manufacturer's written instructions; removing all foreign material from joint substrates that could interfere with adhesion of joint sealant including dust, dirt, old joint sealant material, back rod, oils, grease, loose grout or plaster material, etc.
- e. Clean porous substrate surfaces by brushing, grinding, cutting, mechanical abrading, and or a combination of these methods to produce a clean, sound substrate capable of developing an optimum bond with joint sealant. Remove loose particles by vacuuming or blowing out joints with oil-free compressed air.
- f. Prime joint substrates where recommended in writing by joint sealant manufacturer. Apply primer to comply with manufacturer's written instructions. Confine primers to areas of joint-sealer bond; do not allow spillage or migration onto adjoining surfaces.
- g. Install sealant back rod as needed to support sealants during application and at position required to produce cross-sectional shapes and depths of installed sealants relative to joint widths that allow optimum sealant movement and

- capability. Do not leave gaps between ends of sealant backing. Do not stretch, twist, tear, or puncture sealant backing. Remove sealant backings that have become wet before sealant application and replace with new dry material.
- h. Install sealant using proven techniques. Place sealants so they directly contact and fully wet joints and substrates. Completely fill in recesses in each joint configuration. Produce uniform, cross-sectional shapes, depths, relative to joint widths that allow optimum sealant movement capability.
 - i. Immediately after sealant application and before “skinning” or curing begins, tool sealant according to requirements specified to form a smooth, uniform configuration; to eliminate air pockets, and to ensure contact and adhesion of sealant with sides of joints. Remove excess sealant from surfaces of joints. Use tooling agents that are approved by the sealant manufacturer that do not discolor sealant or adjacent surfaces.
 - j. Clean off excess sealant or sealant smears adjacent to joints as the work progresses and with cleaning materials recommended in writing by the product manufacturer.
 - k. Protect joint sealants during and after curing period from contact with contaminating substances and from damage resulting from other activity, operations, or causes so sealants are without deterioration or damage at the time of acceptance by the County representative. If damage or deterioration occurs, despite such protection, cut out and remove damaged joint sealant immediately and install replacement/repair areas in that are indistinguishable from original work.

III. SCOPE OF WORK: ALTERNATE – INSTALLATION OF LIFE FLOOR LANDING PADS AT RHODES JORDAN AQUATIC CENTER

The successful contractor shall replace landing pads around play features. The play feature is located at Rhodes Jordan Aquatic Center, 100 E Crogan Street, Lawrenceville, GA 30046.

All references to vendors and “approved manufacturers” are included for description of quality and content of the designated equipment/materials. Equivalent items may be accepted if they meet or exceed all standards of quality and purpose for the intended use, as determined by Gwinnett County.

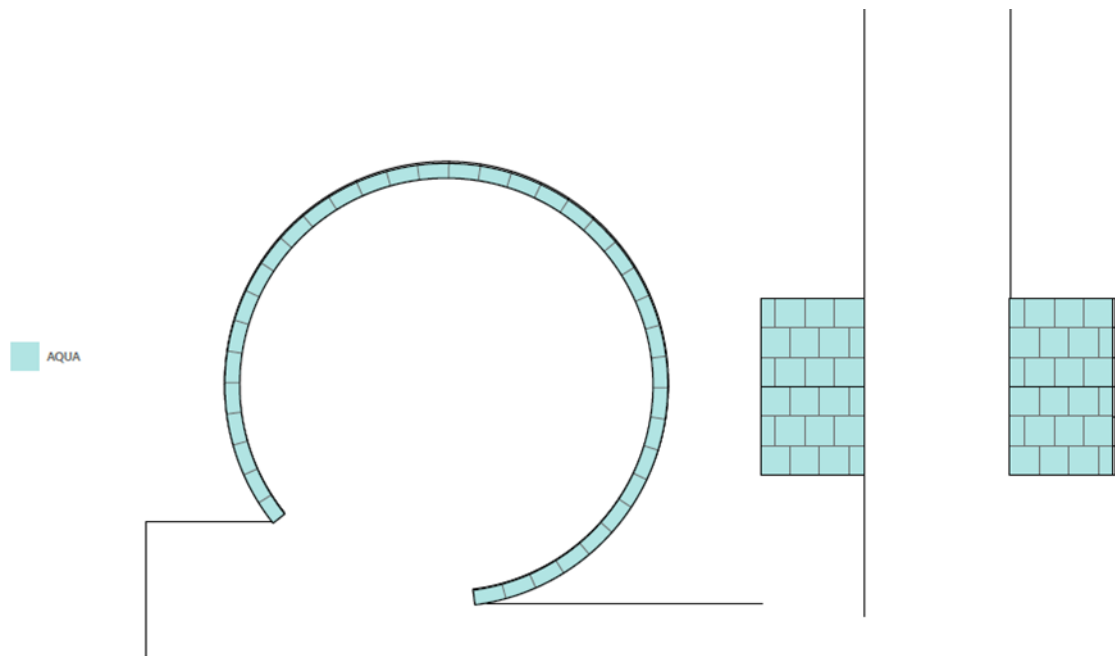
GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Provide LifeFloor tiles and all materials and tools to install or approved alternative to the pool structure. As required, a ceramic tile trim to be furnished and installed on the pool perimeter tile band, vertical tile band, floor, walls, recessed wall steps, depth markings, as applicable.
2. Deliver manufactured materials to site in manufacturers’ original unbroken packages or containers bearing manufacturer’s name and brand labels. Keep cementitious materials dry until ready to be used and stored off the ground, under cover and away from damp surfaces.
3. Confirm and comply with all applicable manufacturer’s installation requirements.
4. Successful certified LifeFloor contractor or intended sub-contractor should provide a minimum of three references for the LifeFloor installers and laborers to show experience in similar pool projects and proper tools to install LifeFloor.
5. After removal inform county representative if concrete is not in good enough shape for new landing pads so appropriate repairs can be made before installation of new landing pads.

A. WORK TO BE PERFORMED

1. Substrate Preparation: Landing Pads
 - a. Remove all old landing pads
 - b. Dispose of properly offsite.
2. Substrate Preparation:
 - a. Properly clean the surface all dirt and debris.
 - b. Diamond grind the substrate to ensure good clean concrete.
 - c. Final preparation of substrate for adhesives per manufacturer specifications.
3. Installation
 - a. Prepare landing pad for installation.
 - b. Install landing pad material.
 - c. Roll landing pad to ensure good adhesion.

B. Proposed Layout for New Landing Pad Tiles



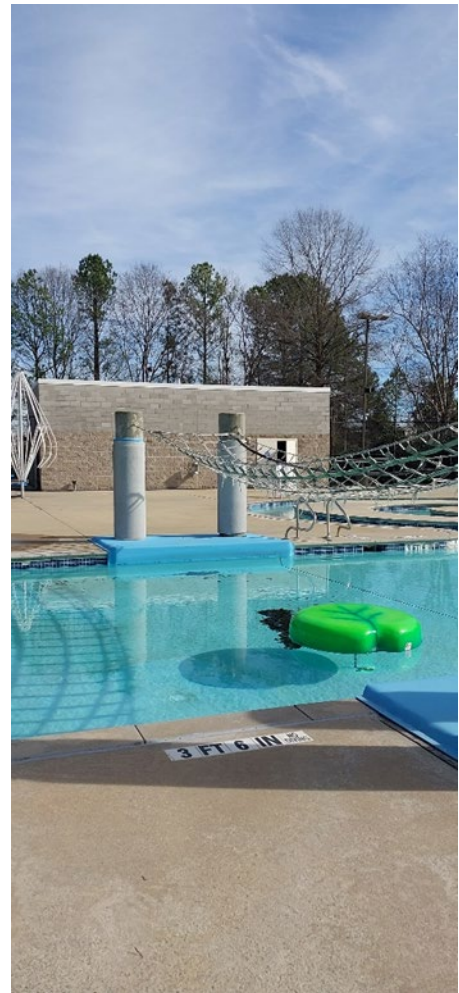
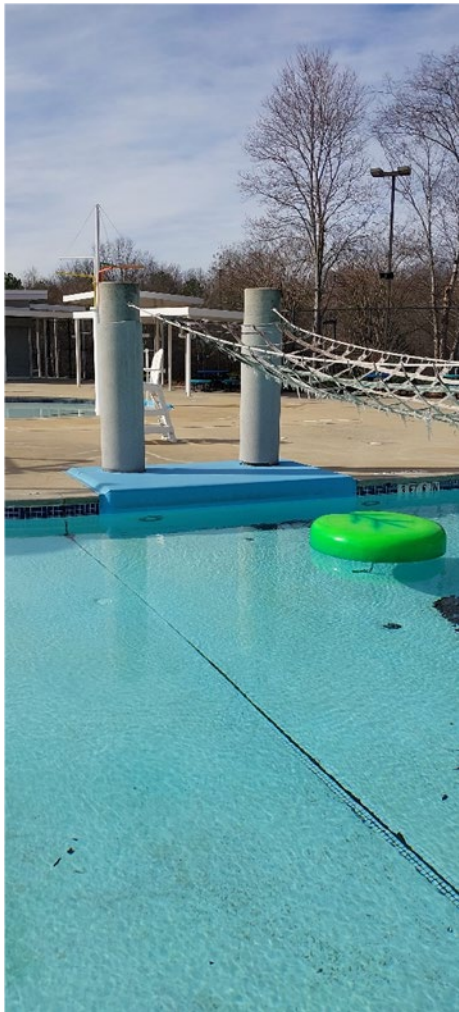

FOR GWINNETT COUNTY CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS**

GC-1 FAMILIARITY WITH SITE

Execution of this agreement by the Contractor is a representation that the Contractor has visited the site, has become familiar with the local conditions under which the work is to be performed, and has correlated personal observations with the requirements of this agreement.

GC-2 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

This agreement consists of Gwinnett County's request for proposals, instructions to bidders, Contractor's proposal, construction contract, Performance Bond, Payment Bond, general conditions, special provisions, specifications, plans, drawings, addenda, and written change orders.

GC-3 DEFINITIONS

The following terms as used in this agreement are defined as follows:

Change Order - a written order to the Contractor, prepared by the Engineer and issued by the County for changes in the work within the general scope of the contract documents, adjustment of the contract price, extension of the contract time, or reservation of determination of a time extension.

County - Gwinnett County, Georgia, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, acting by and through the Chairman of its Board of Commissioners.

Day - a calendar day of twenty-four hours lasting from midnight of one day to midnight the next day.

Notice to Proceed - written communication issued by the County to the Contractor authorizing it to proceed with the work and establishing the date of commencement and completion of the work.

Substantial Completion - the date certified by the engineer when all or a part of the work, identified in the engineer's certification, is sufficiently completed in accordance with the requirements of the contract documents so that the identified portion of the work can be utilized for the purposes for which it is intended.

Work - all of the services specified, indicated, shown or contemplated by the contract documents, and furnishing by the Contractor of all materials, equipment, labor, methods, processes, construction and manufacturing materials and equipment, tools, plans, supplies, power, water, transportation and other things necessary to complete such services in accordance with the contract documents to ensure a functional and complete facility.

GC-4 CODES

All codes, specifications, and standards referenced in the contract documents shall be the latest additions, amendments and revisions of such referenced standards in effect as of the date of the request for proposals for this contract.

GC-5 REVIEW OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

Before making its proposal to the County, and continuously after the execution of the agreement, the Contractor shall carefully study and compare the contract documents and shall at once report to the engineer any error, ambiguity, inconsistency or omission that may be discovered, including

any requirement which may be contrary to any law, ordinance, rule, or regulation of any public authority bearing on the performance of the work. By submitting its proposal, the Contractor agrees that the contract documents, along with any supplementary written instructions issued by or through the engineer that have become a part of the contract documents appear accurate, consistent and complete insofar as can be reasonably determined. If the Contractor has reported in writing any error, inconsistency, or omission to the County, has properly stopped the effected work until instructed to proceed, and has otherwise followed the instructions of the engineer, the Contractor shall not be liable to the County for any damage resulting from any such error, inconsistency, or omission in the contract documents. The Contractor shall not perform any portion of the work without the contract documents, approved plans, specifications, products and data, or samples for such portion of the work.

GC-6 STRICT COMPLIANCE

No observation, inspection, test or approval of the County or engineer shall relieve the Contractor from its obligation to perform the work in strict conformity with the contract documents.

GC-7 APPLICABLE LAW

All applicable State laws, County ordinances, and rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over the construction of the project shall apply to this agreement. All work performed within the right of way of the Georgia Department of Transportation shall be in accordance with DOT regulations, policies and procedures. The Contractor shall comply with all laws, ordinances, rules and regulations bearing on the conduct of the work as specified and the Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees, as well as the engineer, against any claim or liability arising from or based on the violation of any law, ordinance, regulation, order or decree affecting the conduct of the work, whether occasioned by the Contractor, his agents or employees.

GC-8 PERMITS & LICENSES

All permits and licenses necessary for the work shall be secured and paid for by the Contractor. If any permit, license or certificate expires or is revoked, terminated, or suspended as a result of any action on the part of the Contractor, the Contractor shall not be entitled to additional compensation or time.

GC-9 TAXES

The Contractor shall pay all sales, retail, occupational, service, excise, old age benefit and unemployment compensation taxes, consumer, use and other similar taxes, as well as any other taxes or duties on the materials, equipment, and labor for the work provided by the Contractor which are legally enacted by any municipal, county, state or federal authority, department or agency at the time bids are received, whether or not yet effective. The Contractor shall maintain records pertaining to such taxes and levies as well as payment thereof and shall make the same available to the County at all reasonable times for inspection and copying.

GC-10 DELINQUENT CONTRACTORS

The County shall not pay any claim, debt, demand or account whatsoever to any person firm or corporation who is in arrears to the County for taxes. The County shall be entitled to a counterclaim and offset for any such debt in the amount of taxes in arrears, and no assignment or transfer of such debt after the taxes become due shall affect the right of the County to offset any taxes owed against said debt.

GC-11 LIEN WAIVERS

The Contractor shall furnish the County with evidence that all persons who have performed work or furnished materials pursuant to this agreement have been paid in full prior to submitting its

demand for final payment pursuant to this agreement. In the event that such evidence is not furnished, the County may retain sufficient sums necessary to meet all lawful claims of such laborers and materialmen. The County assumes no obligation nor in any way undertakes to pay such lawful claims from any funds due or that may become due to the Contractor.

GC-12 MEASUREMENT

All items of work to be paid for per unit of measurement shall be measured and certified by the Engineer.

GC-13 ASSIGNMENT

The Contractor shall not assign any portion of this agreement or moneys due therefrom without the prior written consent of the County. The Contractor shall retain personal control and shall provide personal attention to the fulfillment of its obligations pursuant to this agreement.

GC-14 FOREIGN CONTRACTORS

In the event that the Contractor is a foreign corporation, partnership, or sole proprietorship, the Contractor hereby irrevocably appoints the Secretary of State of Georgia as its agent for service of all legal process for the purpose of this contract only.

GC-15 INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall, at his sole cost and expense, indemnify, defend, satisfy all judgments, and hold harmless the County, the engineer, and their agents and employees from and against all claims, damages, actions, judgments, costs, penalties, liabilities, losses and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work, provided that any such claim, damage, action, judgment, cost, penalty, liability, loss or expense (1) is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the work itself) including the loss of use resulting therefrom, and (2) is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless whether such claim is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge or otherwise reduce any of the rights or obligations of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this agreement. In any and all claims against the County, the engineer, or any of their agents or employees by any employee of the Contractor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation contained herein shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the Contractor or any subcontractor under Worker's Compensation Acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

GC-16 SUPERVISION OF WORK

The Contractor shall supervise and direct the work using the Contractor's best skill and attention. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for all construction methods and procedures and shall coordinate all portions of the work pursuant to the contract subject to the overall coordination of the engineer. All work pursuant to this agreement shall be performed in a skillful and workmanlike manner.

GC-17 RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORK

The Contractor shall not be relieved from the Contractor's obligations to perform the work in accordance with the contract documents by the activities or duties of the engineer, including inspections, tests or approvals required or performed pursuant to this agreement.

GC-18 RESPONSIBILITY FOR ACTS OF EMPLOYEES

The Contractor shall be responsible to the County for the acts and omissions of its employees, subcontractors, and agents as well as any other persons performing work pursuant to this agreement. All areas within the limits of the Project which are determined by the Engineer to be unnecessarily damaged, due either directly or indirectly to the process of construction, shall be responsibility of the Contractor to correct and repair. This is not a payment item and shall be done without additional compensation.

GC-19 PAYMENT FOR LABOR AND MATERIALS

Unless otherwise provided in this agreement, the Contractor shall provide and pay for all labor, materials, equipment, tools, construction equipment and machinery, water, heat, utilities, transportation, and other facilities and services necessary for the execution and completion of the work.

GC-20 DISCIPLINE ON WORK SITE

The Contractor shall enforce strict discipline and good order among its employees and subcontractors at all times during the performance of the work. The Contractor shall not employ any subcontractor who is not skilled in the task assigned to it. The engineer may, by written notice, require the Contractor to remove from the work any subcontractor or employee deemed by the engineer to be incompetent.

GC-21 HOURS OF OPERATION

All work at the construction site shall be performed during regular business hours, except upon the engineer's prior written consent to other work hours.

GC-22 FAMILIARITY WITH WORK CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall take all steps necessary to ascertain the nature and location of the work and the general and local conditions, which may affect the work or the cost thereof. The Contractor's failure to fully acquaint itself with the conditions which may affect the work, including, but not limited to conditions relating to transportation, handling, storage of materials, availability of labor, water, roads, weather, topographic and subsurface conditions, other separate contracts to be entered into by the County relating to the project which may affect the work of the Contractor, applicable provisions of law, and the character and availability of equipment and facilities necessary prior to and during the performance of the work shall not relieve the Contractor of its responsibilities pursuant to this agreement and shall not constitute a basis for an equitable adjustment of the contract terms. The County assumes no responsibility for any understandings or representations concerning conditions of the work made by any of its officers, agents, or employees prior to the execution of this agreement.

GC-23 RIGHT OF ENTRY

The County reserves the right to enter the site of the work by such agent as it may elect for the purpose of inspecting the work or installing such collateral work as the County may desire.

GC-24 NOTICES

Any notice, order, instruction, claim or other written communication required pursuant to this agreement shall be deemed to have been delivered or received as follows:

- (1) Upon personal delivery to the Contractor, it's authorized representative, or the engineer on behalf of the County. Personal delivery may be accomplished by in-person hand delivery or bona fide overnight express service.
- (2) Three days after depositing in the United States mail a certified letter addressed to the Contractor, the County, or the engineer. For purposes of mailed notices, the County's mailing address shall be 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30046. The Contractor's mailing address shall be the address stated in its proposal, and the engineer's mailing address shall

be its address listed in the Notice to Begin Work.

GC-25 SAFETY

The Contractor shall take all reasonable precautions for the safety of all persons and property associated with the work, and the Contractor shall erect and maintain, as required by existing conditions and the progress of the work, all reasonable safeguards for the safety and protection of persons in the vicinity of the project.

GC-26 BLASTING AND EXCAVATION

The Contractor acknowledges that it is fully aware of the contents and requirements of O.C.G.A. § 25-9-1 through 25-9-12 concerning blasting and excavation near underground gas pipes and facilities and shall fully comply therewith.

GC-27 HIGH VOLTAGE LINES

The Contractor acknowledges that it is fully aware of the contents and requirements O.C.G.A. § 46-3-30 through 46-3-39 concerning safeguards against contact with high voltage lines, and the Contractor shall fully comply with said provisions.

GC-28 SCAFFOLDING AND STAGING

The Contractor acknowledges that it is the person responsible for employing and directing others to perform labor within the meaning of O.C.G.A. § 34-1-1 and agrees to comply with said provisions.

GC-29 CLEAN-UP

The Contractor shall clean up all refuse, rubbish, scrap materials, and debris caused by its operations to the end that the site of the work shall present a neat, orderly and workmanlike appearance at all times.

GC-30 PROTECTION OF WORK

The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance and protection of the work until final completion of this agreement and acceptance of the work as defined herein. Any portion of the work suffering injury, damage or loss shall be considered defective and shall be corrected or replaced by the Contractor without additional cost to the County.

GC-31 REJECTED WORK

The Contractor shall promptly remove from the project all work rejected by the engineer for failure to comply with the contract documents and the Contractor shall promptly replace and re-execute the work in accordance with the contract documents and without expense to the County. The Contractor shall also bear the expense of making good all work of other Contractors destroyed or damaged by such removal or replacement.

GC-32 DEFECTIVE WORK

If the Contractor defaults or neglects to carry out any portion of the work in accordance with the contract documents, and fails within three days after receipt of written notice from the County or the engineer to commence and continue correction of such default or neglect with diligence and promptness, the County or the engineer may, after three days following receipt by the Contractor of an additional written notice and without prejudice to any other remedy the County may have, make good such deficiencies and complete all or any portion of any work through such means as the County may select, including the use of a new Contractor. In such case, an appropriate change order shall be issued deducting from the payments then or thereafter due the Contractor the cost of correcting such deficiencies. In the event the payments then or thereafter due the Contractor are not sufficient to cover such amount, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the County on demand.

GC-33 NEW MATERIALS

The Contractor warrants to the County that all materials and equipment furnished under this contract will be new unless otherwise specified, and the Contractor further warrants that all work will be of good quality, free from faults and defects, and in conformance with the contract documents. The warranty set forth in this paragraph shall survive final acceptance of the work.

GC-34 CONTRACTOR'S WARRANTY

If within one year after the date of substantial completion and final acceptance of the work by the County, or within such longer period of time as may be prescribed by law or by the term of any applicable special warranty required by the contract documents, any of the work is found to be defective or not in accordance with the contract documents, the Contractor shall correct such work promptly after receipt of written notice from the County to do so. This obligation shall survive both final payment for the work and termination of the contract.

GC-35 ASSIGNMENT OF MANUFACTURERS' WARRANTIES

Without limiting the responsibility or liability of the Contractor pursuant to this agreement, all warranties given by manufacturers on materials or equipment incorporated in the work are hereby assigned by the Contractor to the County. If requested, the Contractor shall execute formal assignments of said manufacturer's warranties to the County. All such warranties shall be directly enforceable by the County.

GC-36 WARRANTIES IMPLIED BY LAW

The warranties contained in this agreement, as well as those warranties implied by law, shall be deemed cumulative and shall not be deemed alternative or exclusive. No one or more of the warranties contained herein shall be deemed to alter or limit any other.

GC-37 STOP WORK ORDERS

In the event that the Contractor fails to correct defective work as required by the contract documents or fails to carry out the work in accordance with contract documents, the County, or the engineer, in writing, may order the Contractor to stop work until the cause for such order has been eliminated. This right of the County or engineer to stop work shall not give rise to any duty on the part of the County or the engineer to execute this right for the benefit of the Contractor or for any other person or entity.

GC-38 TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

If the Contractor is adjudged bankrupt, makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, suffers the appointment of a receiver on account of its insolvency, or fails to supply sufficient properly skilled workers, materials, fails to make prompt payment to subcontractors or materialmen, disregards laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, or orders of any public authority having jurisdiction, or is otherwise guilty of a material violation of this agreement and fails within seven days after receipt of written notice to commence and continue correction of such default, neglect, or violation with diligence and promptness, the County may, after ten days following receipt by the Contractor of an additional written notice and without prejudice to any other remedy the County may have, terminate the employment of the Contractor and take possession of the site as well as all materials, equipment, tools, construction equipment and machinery thereon. The County may finish the work by whatever methods the County deems expedient. In such case, the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the work is completed. If the unpaid balance of the contract price exceeds the cost of completing the work, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor. If such costs exceed the unpaid balance, the Contractor shall pay the difference to the County on demand. This obligation for payment shall survive the termination of the contract. Termination of this agreement pursuant to this paragraph may result in

disqualification of the Contractor from bidding on future County contracts.

GC-39 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

The County may, at any time upon 30 days written notice to the Contractor, terminate the whole or any portion of the work for the convenience of the County. Said termination shall be without prejudice to any right or remedy of the County provided herein. In addition, in the event this agreement has been terminated due to the default of the Contractor, and if it is later determined that the Contractor was not in default pursuant to the provisions of this agreement at the time of termination, then such termination shall be considered a termination for convenience pursuant to this paragraph.

GC-40 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE - PAYMENT

In the event that the County terminates this agreement for the convenience of the County, the County shall only be liable to the Contractor for those costs reimbursable to the Contractor plus a mark-up of ten percent on the actual fully accounted cost recovered pursuant to this paragraph. In the event that it appears that the Contractor would have sustained a loss on the entire contract had it been completed, no profit shall be included or allowed hereunder and an appropriate adjustment shall be made reducing the amount of settlement to reflect the indicated rate of loss. In the event of termination for the convenience of the County, the County shall pay the Contractor the following amounts determined by the engineer:

- A. An amount for supplies, services, or property accepted by the County for which payment has not previously been made. The price to be paid for these items shall be equivalent to the aggregate price for such supplies or services computed in accordance with the price specified in this agreement appropriately adjusted for any saving of freight or other charges; and
- B. The total of:
 - (1) The costs incurred in the performance of the work terminated, including initial costs and preparatory expenses allocable thereto, but exclusive of any costs attributable to supplies or services previously paid;
 - (2) The costs of settling and paying claims arising pursuant to the termination of the work under said contracts or orders which are properly chargeable to the terminated portion of the contract (exclusive of the amounts paid or payable on account of completed items or equipment delivered or services furnished by a subcontractor or vendor prior to the effective date of the notice of termination, which amounts shall be included in the costs payable pursuant to (A)); and
 - (3) The reasonable costs of settlement, including accounting, legal, clerical, and other expenses reasonable and necessary for the preparation of settlement claims and supporting data with respect to the terminated portion of the contract and for the termination and settlement of subcontracts thereunder, together with reasonable storage, transportation, and other costs incurred in connection with the protection or disposition of property allocable to this agreement.

GC-41 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE - PAYMENT LIMITATIONS

In the event of termination for the convenience of the County, the total sum to be paid to the Contractor shall not exceed the contract price as reduced by the amount of payments otherwise made, by the contract price for work not terminated, and as otherwise permitted by the contract. Except for normal spoilage, and except to the extent that the County shall have otherwise expressly assumed the risk of loss, there shall be excluded from the amounts payable to the

Contractor the fair value, as determined by the engineer, of property which is destroyed, lost, stolen or damaged so as to become undeliverable to the County or to another buyer.

GC-42 COST TO CURE

If the County terminates the whole or any part of the work pursuant to this agreement, then the County may procure upon such terms and in such manner as the engineer may deem appropriate, supplies or services similar to those so terminated, and the Contractor shall be liable to the County for any excess costs for such similar supplies or services. The Contractor shall continue the performance of this agreement to the extent not terminated hereunder.

GC-43 ATTORNEY'S FEES

Should the Contractor default pursuant to any of the provisions of this agreement, the Contractor and its surety shall pay to the County such reasonable attorney's fees as the County may expend as a result thereof and all costs, expenses, and filing fees incidental thereto.

GC-44 CONTRACTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES UPON TERMINATION

After receipt of a notice of termination from the County, and except as otherwise directed by the engineer, the Contractor shall:

1. Stop work under the contract on the date and to the extent specified in the notice of termination;
2. Place no further orders or subcontracts for materials, services or facilities, except as may be necessary for completion of such portion of the work under the agreement as is not terminated;
3. Terminate all orders and subcontracts to the extent that they relate to the performance of work terminated by the notice of termination;
4. Assign to the County in the manner, at the times, and to the extent directed by the engineer, all of the rights, title and interest of the Contractor under the orders and subcontracts so terminated, in which case the County shall have the right, at its discretion, to settle or pay any and all claims arising out of the termination of such orders or subcontracts;
5. Settle all outstanding liabilities and all claims arising out of such termination of orders and subcontracts, with the approval or ratification of the engineer, to the extent the engineer may require, which approval or ratification shall be final for all purposes;
6. Transfer title and deliver to the entity or entities designated by the County, in the manner, at the times, and to the extent, if any, directed by the engineer, and to the extent specifically produced or specifically acquired by the Contractor for the performance of such portion of the work as has been terminated:
 - (a) The fabricated or unfabricated parts, work, and progress, partially completed supplies, and equipment, materials, parts, tools, dyes, jigs, and other fixtures, completed work, supplies, and other material produced as a part of or acquired in connection with the performance of the work terminated by the notice of termination; and
 - (b) The completed or partially completed plans, drawings, information, and other property to the work.

7. Use its best efforts to sell in the manner, at the times, to the extent, and at the prices directed or authorized by the engineer, any property described in Section 6 of this paragraph, provided, however, that the Contractor shall not be required to extend credit to any buyer and further provided that the proceeds of any such transfer or disposition shall be applied in reduction of any payments to be made by the County to the Contractor pursuant to this agreement.
8. Complete performance of such part of the work as shall not have been terminated by the notice of termination; and
9. Take such action as may be necessary, or as the engineer may direct, for the protection and preservation of the property related to the agreement which is in the possession of the Contractor and in which the County has or may acquire an interest.

GC-45 RECORDS

The Contractor shall preserve and make available to the County all of its records, books, documents and other evidence bearing on the costs and expenses of the Contractor and any subcontractor pursuant to this agreement upon three days advance notice to the Contractor.

GC-46 DEDUCTIONS

In arriving at any amount due the Contractor pursuant to the terms of this agreement, there shall be deducted all liquidated damages, advance payments made to the Contractor applicable to the termination portion of the contract, the amount of any claim which the County may have against the Contractor, the amount determined by the engineer to be necessary to protect the County against loss due to outstanding potential liens or claims, and the agreed price of any materials acquired or sold by the Contractor and not otherwise recovered by or credited to the County.

GC-47 REIMBURSEMENT OF THE COUNTY

In the event of termination, the Contractor shall refund to the County any amount paid by the County to the Contractor in excess of the costs reimbursable to the Contractor.

GC-48 TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE - DELAY

The Contractor shall be entitled to only those damages and that relief from termination by the County as specifically set forth in this agreement. The County or the engineer may issue a written order requiring the Contractor to suspend, delay or interrupt all or any part of the work for such period of time as the County may determine to be appropriate for the convenience of the County. If the performance of the work is interrupted for an unreasonable period of time by an act of the County or engineer in the administration of this agreement, an equitable adjustment shall be made for any increase in the Contractor's costs of performance and any increase in the time required for performance of the work necessarily caused by the unreasonable suspension, delay, or interruption. Any equitable adjustment shall be reduced to writing and shall constitute a modification to this agreement. In no event, however, shall an equitable adjustment be made to the extent that performance of this agreement would have been suspended, delayed or interrupted by any other cause, including the fault or negligence of the Contractor. No claim for an equitable adjustment pursuant to this paragraph shall be permitted before the Contractor shall have notified the engineer in writing of the act or failure to act involved, and no claim shall be allowed unless asserted in writing to the engineer within ten days after the termination of such suspension, delay or interruption.

GC-49 COMMENCEMENT AND DURATION OF WORK

The Contractor shall commence work pursuant to this agreement within ten days of mailing or delivery of written notice to proceed by the County. The Contractor shall diligently prosecute the work to completion within the time specified therefore. The capacity of the Contractor's construction and manufacturing equipment and plan, sequence and method of operation and forces employed, including management and supervisory personnel, shall be such as to ensure completion of the work within the specified time. The Contractor and County hereby agree that the contract time for completion of the work is reasonable taking into consideration the average climatic conditions prevailing in the locality of the work.

GC-50 TIME OF THE ESSENCE

All time limits stated in this agreement are of the essence of this contract.

GC-51 IMPACT DAMAGES

Except as specifically provided pursuant to a stop work order or change order, the Contractor shall not be entitled to payment or compensation of any kind from the County for direct or indirect or impact damages including, but not limited to, costs of acceleration arising because of delay, disruption, interference or hindrance from any cause whatsoever whether such delay, disruption, interference or hindrance is reasonable or unreasonable, foreseeable or unforeseeable, or avoidable, provided, however, that this provision shall not preclude the recovery of damages by the Contractor for hindrances or delays due solely to fraud or bad faith on the part of the County its agents or employees. The Contractor shall be entitled only to extensions in the time required for performance of the work as specifically provided in the contract.

GC-52 DELAY

The Contractor may be entitled to an extension of the contract time, but not an increase in the contract price, for delays arising from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor or its subcontractors for labor strikes, acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of the state, federal or local government in its sovereign capacity, by acts of another separate contractor, or by an act of neglect of the County with the engineer.

GC-53 INCLEMENT WEATHER

The Contractor shall not be entitled to an extension of the contract time due to normal inclement weather. Unless the Contractor can substantiate to the satisfaction of the engineer that there was greater than normal inclement weather considering the full term of the contract using a ten year average of accumulated mean values for climatological data compiled by the U.S. Department of Commerce for Atlanta, Georgia and that such greater than normal inclement weather actually delayed the work, the Contractor shall not be entitled to an extension of time therefor.

GC-54 NOTICE OF DELAY

The Contractor shall not receive an extension of time unless a notice of a claim is filed with the County and the engineer within ten days of the first instance of such delay, disruption, interference or hindrance and a written statement of the claim is filed with the engineer and the County within 20 days of the first such instance. In the event that the Contractor fails to comply with this provision, it waives any claim, which it may have for an extension of time pursuant to this agreement.

GC-55 NOTICE OF DELAY - CONTENTS

The notice of delay referenced in the preceding paragraph shall include specific information concerning the nature of the delay, the date of commencement of the delay, the construction activities affected by the delay, the person or organization responsible for the delay, the anticipated extent of the delay, and any recommended action to avoid or minimize the delay.

GC-56 PROGRESS OF WORK

To the extent that the Contractor is entitled to additional compensation for delay, an absolute condition precedent to such entitlement shall be strict compliance with all requirements and procedures for entitlement to an extension of time herein. If the work actually in place falls behind the currently updated and approved project network schedule, and it becomes apparent from the current schedule that work will not be completed within the contract time, the Contractor agrees that it will, as necessary, or as directed by the engineer, take action at no additional cost to the County to improve the progress of the work, including increasing manpower, increasing the number of working hours per shift or shifts per working day, increasing the amount of equipment at the site, and any other measure reasonably required to complete the work in a timely fashion.

GC-57 DILIGENCE

The Contractor's failure to substantially comply with the requirements of the preceding paragraph may be grounds for determination by the County or engineer that the Contractor is failing to prosecute the work with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified. In such event, the County shall have the right to furnish such additional labor and materials as may be required to comply with the schedule after 48 hours written notice to the Contractor, and the Contractor shall be liable for such costs incurred by the County.

GC-58 SET-OFFS

Any monies due to the County pursuant to the acceleration provisions of this agreement may be deducted by the County against monies due from the County to the Contractor.

GC-59 ACCELERATION - REMEDIES

The remedies of the County concerning acceleration are in addition to and without prejudice to all of the rights and remedies of the County at law, in equity, or contained in this agreement.

GC-60 TITLE TO MATERIALS

No materials or supplies shall be purchased by the Contractor or by any Subcontractor subject to any chattel mortgage or under a conditional sales contract or other agreement by which any interest is retained by the seller. The Contractor hereby warrants that it has good and marketable title to all materials and supplies used by it in the work, and the Contractor further warrants that all materials and supplies shall be free from all liens, claims, or encumbrances at the time of incorporation in the work.

GC-61 INSPECTION OF MATERIALS

All materials and equipment used in the construction of the project shall be subject to adequate inspection and testing in accordance with accepted standards and in accordance with the requirements of the contract documents. Additional tests performed after the rejection of materials or equipment shall be at the Contractor's expense.

GC-62 ENGINEER'S PRESENCE DURING TESTING

All tests performed by the Contractor shall be witnessed by the engineer unless the requirement therefor is waived in writing. The engineer may perform additional tests on materials previously tested by the Contractor, and the Contractor shall furnish samples for this purpose as requested.

GC-63 MATERIALS INCORPORATED IN WORK

The Contractor shall furnish all materials and equipment to be incorporated in the work. All such materials or equipment shall be new and of the highest quality available. Manufactured materials and equipment shall be obtained from sources, which are currently manufacturing such materials, except as otherwise specifically approved by the engineer.

GC-64 STORAGE OF MATERIALS

Materials and equipment to be incorporated in the work shall be stored in such a manner as to preserve their quality and fitness for the work and to facilitate inspection.

GC-65 PAYROLL REPORTS

The Contractor shall be required to furnish weekly payroll reports to the engineer certifying conformance with the wage rates listed in the specifications.

GC-66 CONTRACTORS' REPRESENTATIVE

Before beginning work, the Contractor shall notify the engineer in writing of one person within its organization who shall have complete authority to supervise the work, receive orders from the engineer, and represent the Contractor in all matters arising pursuant to this agreement. The Contractor shall not remove its representative without first designating in writing a new representative. The Contractor's representative shall normally be present at or about the site of work while the work is in progress. When neither the Contractor nor its representative is present at the work site, the superintendent, foreman, or other employee in charge of the work shall be an authorized representative of the Contractor.

GC-67 SPECIALTY SUB-CONTRACTORS

The Contractor may utilize the services of specialty subcontractors on those parts of the project which, under normal contracting practices, are performed by specialty subcontractors. Neither the Contractor nor any subcontractor shall award work to any subcontractor without the prior written consent of the County. The Contractor shall not award more than seventy-five percent of the work to subcontractors.

GC-68 INSPECTION BY ENGINEERS

All work pursuant to this agreement shall be subject to inspection by the engineer for conformity with contract drawings and specifications. The Contractor shall give the engineer reasonable advance notice of operations requiring special inspection of a portion of the work.

GC-69 WORK COVERED PRIOR TO ENGINEER'S INSPECTION

In the event that work is covered or completed without the approval of the engineer, and such approval is required by the specifications or required in advance by the engineer, the Contractor shall bear all costs involved in inspection notwithstanding conformance of such portion of the work to the contract drawings and specifications.

GC-70 ENGINEER'S AUTHORITY

The engineer shall have the authority to decide all questions concerning interpretation and fulfillment of contract requirements, including, without limitation, all questions concerning the prosecution, progress, quality and acceptability of the work. Any oral decision or instruction of the engineer shall be confirmed in writing. All communications between the County and the Contractor shall be made through the engineer. The Contractor shall submit to the engineer a complete schedule of values of various portions of the work, including quantities and unit prices, aggregating the contract price. The schedule shall subdivide the work into component parts in sufficient detail to serve as the basis for progress payments during construction. Each item in the schedule of values shall include its proper share of overhead and profit. The schedule of values, when approved by the engineer, shall be used only as a basis for the Contractor's monthly request for payment and shall not be used for additions to or deductions from the contract amount.

GC-71 PROGRESS ESTIMATES

The Contractor shall also prepare a written report for the engineer's approval, on County forms, of the total amount of value of work performed to the date of submission. No progress estimate or payment

shall be considered an approval or acceptance of any work performed, and all estimates and payments shall be subject to correction in subsequent estimates. Progress payments shall be made for all completed activities and for suitably stored materials.

GC-72 PROGRESS PAYMENTS

Upon completion of each monthly estimate of work performed and materials furnished, the engineer shall recommend payment to the Contractor for the estimated value of such work, materials, and equipment, less the amount of all prior payments and all liquidated damages. The Contractor will be paid 100 percent, less retainage, of the cost of materials received and properly stored but not incorporated into the work. Payments for materials or equipment stored on the site shall be conditioned upon submission by the Contractor of bills of sale to establish the County's title to such materials or equipment. No progress estimate or payment need be made when, in the engineer's judgment, the increment in the estimated value of work performed and materials furnished since the preceding estimate is less than \$10,000.

GC-73 TIME OF PAYMENT

When the contractor has performed in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, Gwinnett County shall pay to the contractor, within 30 days of receipt by the County of any payment request based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the contract, the sum so requested, less the retainage stated in this Agreement, if any. In the event that Gwinnett County fails to pay the contractor within 60 days of the County's receipt of a pay request based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the contract, the County shall pay the contractor interest at the rate of 1/2 percent per month or pro rata fraction thereof beginning the 61st day following the County's receipt of the pay request. The contractor's acceptance of progress payments or final payment shall release all claims for interest on said payments. The provisions of this agreement are intended to supersede all provisions of the Georgia Prompt Pay Act as provided by law.

GC-74 RETAINAGE

Until the payment for Substantial Completion, the County shall withhold retainage in the amount of five percent (5%) from each progress payment. When Substantial Completion is achieved, retainage shall be paid to Contractor with the final payment in accordance with the terms of Section GC-82.

GC-75 PAYMENT OF SUBCONTRACTORS

GC-75.1 GENERAL

The Contractor shall promptly pay each subcontractor upon the receipt of payment from the County. Such payment shall be made from the amount paid to the Contractor pursuant to the subcontractor's work. The Contractor shall also maintain the records of the percentage retained from payments to the Contractor pursuant to such subcontractor's work. The Contractor shall procure agreements from each subcontractor requiring each subcontractor to pay their subcontractors, agents and employees in a similar manner.

GC-75.2 SUBCONTRACTOR RETAINAGE RELEASE

Upon request by Contractor, the County may, in its sole discretion, permit an amount equal to the retainage associated with a subcontractor's work to be released from the retainage held by the County upon completion of the subcontractor's work. To request subcontractor retainage release, Contractor shall submit a written request to the County that (a) certifies the subcontractor's work is complete and specifies the amount of retainage withheld by Contractor, (b) contains a release of all claims by the subcontractor, and (c) is executed by the Contractor, subcontractor, and, if required by the County, the engineer.

GC-76 COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITIES TO SUBCONTRACTORS

Neither the County nor the engineer shall have any obligation to pay any subcontractor except as

otherwise required by law.

GC-77 PROGRESS PAYMENTS - ACCEPTANCE OF WORK

Certification of progress payments, as well as the actual payment thereof, shall not constitute the County's acceptance of work performed pursuant to this agreement.

GC-78 PAYMENTS IN TRUST

All sums paid to the Contractor pursuant to this agreement are hereby declared to constitute trust funds in the hands of the contractor to be applied first to the payment of claims of subcontractors, laborers, and suppliers arising out of the work, to claims for utilities furnished and taxes imposed, and to the payment of premiums on surety and other bonds and on insurance for any other application.

GC-79 JOINT PAYMENTS

The County reserves the right to issue any progress payment or final payment by check jointly to the Contractor and any subcontractor or supplier.

GC-80 RIGHT TO WITHHOLD PAYMENT

The engineer may decline to approve payment and may withhold payment in whole or in part to the extent reasonable and necessary to protect the County against loss due to defective work, probable or actual third party claims, the Contractor's failure to pay subcontractors or materialmen, reasonable evidence that the work will not be completed within the contract time or contract price or damage to the County or any other contractor on the project.

GC-81 CERTIFICATE OF SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION

Upon the Contractor's submission of a request for a certificate of substantial completion, the engineer shall inspect the work and determine whether the work is substantially complete. If the work is substantially complete, the engineer shall issue a certificate of substantial completion of the work which shall establish the date of substantial completion, shall state the responsibilities of the County and the Contractor for security, maintenance, heat, utilities, damage to the work and insurance, and shall fix the time within which the Contractor shall complete the items submitted by the Contractor as requiring correction or further work. The certificate of substantial completion of the work shall be submitted to the County and the Contractor for their written acceptance of the responsibilities assigned to them pursuant to such certificate.

GC-82 FINAL PAYMENT

GC-82.1 GENERAL

Upon Substantial Completion of the work and upon application by the Contractor and approval by the engineer, the County shall make payment reflecting adjustments and retainage for the work as provided in this agreement.

GC-82.2 AMOUNT TO BE WITHHELD

Upon receipt of an application for final payment, the engineer shall designate amounts to be withheld from the payment for incomplete work and/or defective work to be remedied. The amounts withheld shall equal 200 percent of the value of each item of incomplete work and defective work to be remedied. Such amount shall be withheld until completion and remediation of such work.

GC-83 COMMENCEMENT OF WARRANTIES

Warranties required by this agreement shall commence on the date of final completion of the project unless otherwise provided in the certificate of substantial completion.

GC-84 FINAL PAYMENT - WAIVER OF CLAIMS

The acceptance of the substantial completion payment shall constitute a waiver of all claims by the Contractor except those previously made in writing and identified by the Contractor as unsettled at the time of application for payment at substantial completion and except for the retainage sums due at final acceptance. Following the engineer's issuance of the certificate of substantial completion and the Contractor's completion of the work pursuant to this agreement, the Contractor shall forward to the engineer a written notice that the work is ready for final inspection and acceptance and shall also forward to the engineer a final application for payment. When the engineer finds the work acceptable and determines that the contract has been fully performed, the engineer shall issue a certificate for payment which shall approve final payment to the Contractor.

GC-85 DOCUMENTATION OF COMPLETION OF WORK

Neither the final payment nor the remaining retainage shall become due until the Contractor submits the following documents to the engineer:

- A. An affidavit that all payrolls, bills for materials and equipment, and other indebtedness connected with the work have been paid other otherwise satisfied;
- B. The surety's consent to final payment; and
- C. Any other data reasonably required by the County or engineer establishing payment or satisfaction of all such obligations, including releases, waivers of liens, and documents of satisfaction of debts.

In the event that a subcontractor refuses to furnish a release or waiver as required by the County or engineer, the Contractor may furnish a bond satisfactory to the County to indemnify the County against such loss. In the event that any lien or indebtedness remains unsatisfied after all payments are made, the contractor shall refund to the County all moneys that the County may become compelled to pay in discharging such lien or other indebtedness, including all costs and reasonable attorney's fees.

GC-86 GOVERNING LAW

Each and every provision of this agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by Georgia law. The parties acknowledge that this contract is executed in Gwinnett County, Georgia and that the contract is to be performed in Gwinnett County, Georgia. Each party hereby consents to the Gwinnett Superior Court's sole jurisdiction over any dispute which arises as a result of the execution or performance of this agreement, and each party hereby waives any and all objections to venue in the Gwinnett Superior Court.

GC-87 CHANGES AND EXTRA WORK

GC-87.1 AUTHORITY FOR CHANGES

The County may make changes in the Drawings or Specifications and in the quantities of Work to be done under the Contract

C-87.2 CHANGE ORDERS

Without invalidating the Contract, the County may at any time or from time to time, by written order, order additions, deletions, or revisions in the Work related to the original scope of the Work. Change Orders will authorize these. Upon receipt of the Change Order, Contractor shall promptly proceed with the work involved. If any price or scope of the Work or an extension or shortening of the Contract Time is involved, an equitable

adjustment will be made within the Change Order. In the event the Change Order increases the contract price, the penal amount of the Payment and Performance Bonds shall be increased as provided for in Section GC-15. All changes in the Work authorized by Change Order shall be performed under the applicable Conditions of the Contract Documents.

GC-87.3 WRITTEN NOTICE

The County may, at the request of the Contractor, issue interpretations, clarifications and other instructions as to the intent of the Contract Documents, in the form of Written Notices. The County may also, at any time, make changes in the details of the Work by issuance of a Written Notice. Upon receipt of such a Written Notice containing interpretations, clarifications and other instructions, Contractor shall proceed with the Work and comply with the Written Notice unless Contractor believes that such Written Notice entitles him to a Change in Contract Price or Time or both.

Should Contractor believe that such Written Notice entitles him to change in Contract Price or Time, or both, he shall give the County notice in writing thereof within seven (7) days after receipt of the Written Notice. Thereafter within thirty (30) days, Contractor shall document the basis for the change in Contract Price or Time. The County shall render a timely, written decision on the Contractor's request for a change in Contract Price or Time. Should the County determine that the Contractor is not entitled to a change in Contract Time or Price, the Contractor shall proceed as directed upon receipt of the County's decision. Failure to proceed shall constitute a breach of Contract and shall be a cause for the termination of the Contract. Request for a Change Order arising out of a Written Notice will not be considered without the attachment thereto of a copy of the referenced Written Notice. No claim by Contractor will be allowed if asserted after Final Payment under this Contract.

GC-87.4 EXTRA WORK

Extra work consists of new and unforeseen work determined by the County not to be covered by any of the various items for which there is a bid price or by combination of such items.

GC-87.5 VARIATION IN QUANTITIES

Wherever the estimated quantities of work to be done and materials to be furnished under this Contract are shown in any of the documents including the Proposal, they are given for use in comparing bids and the right is especially reserved except as herein otherwise specifically limited, to increase or diminish them as may be deemed reasonably necessary or desirable by County to complete the Work contemplated by this Contract, and such increase or diminution shall in no way vitiate this Contract, nor shall any such increase or diminution give cause for claims or liability for damages.

GC-88 CHANGE ORDERS

GC-88.1 GENERAL

The Contract Price may only be changed by a Written Change Order. Each change will be set forth in a Change Order prepared by the County and approved by County. Change Orders will specify (a) all additional work to be done and work to be omitted, if any, in connection with the change; (b) the basis of compensation to the Contractor for additional or omitted work; and (c) any adjustment of the time of completion of the Work. If the County determines that a change requiring additional work will cause delay in completion of Work, he will grant an equitable time extension for the changed work, or a subsequent Change Order may be issued at such time as the extent of such delay can be determined.

Upon receipt of a Change Order, Contractor shall comply therewith and perform each item of work set forth therein, furnishing all labor, material, and equipment necessary therefore, in the same manner as if such work were originally included in the Contract. In the absence of a Change Order, Contractor shall not be entitled to payment or an extension of the time of completion on account of any changes made.

GC-88.2 METHODS OF PAYMENT

The value of any work covered by a Change Order or any claim for an increase or decrease in the Contract Price shall be determined by the following method which is most advantageous to County, as determined by the County:

- A. Where the work involved is covered by unit prices contained in Contract Documents, by application of unit prices to the quantities of the items involved.
- B. By mutual acceptance of a lump sum, based on a detailed breakdown of anticipated costs plus Contractor's fee for overhead, small tools, and profit.
- C. On the basis of the actual cost of the work plus a Contractor's fee for overhead, small tools and profit. This method of payment is herein referred to as force account work. Contractor's fee for force account work performed by his own forces shall be twenty percent (20%) for direct labor and payroll burdens; five percent (5%) for all purchased material; and Contractor's fee for subcontracted work shall be as defined hereinafter.

GC-88.3 LUMP SUM CHANGE ORDER WORK

Contractor shall prepare an estimate of all extra and deleted work as described by Written Notice, using established unit prices where they are stated in the Bidding Documents. Estimates for labor, bonds, insurance, materials, and equipment required shall otherwise be based on the provisions set forth hereinafter.

GC-88.4 CHANGE ORDERS LIMITED

Except as provided herein, no order, statement or conduct of the County or the Construction Program Manager shall be treated as a "Change Order" or entitle the Contractor to any adjustment hereunder of the Contract Price or Contract Time.

GC-88.5 NO WORK STOPPAGE

Nothing in this Article shall excuse the Contractor from proceeding with the Contract as changed.

GC-88.6 CONTRACT AMENDMENT

The amount payable to the Contractor under the Contract, the Contract Time, and the date required for performance of any part of the Work may be changed only by a Change Order to the Contract.

GC-89 FORCE ACCOUNT WORK

Force account work is an Owner-defined emergency, a sudden or unforeseen failure or malfunction of an existing system, which results in the Contractor being obligated to respond to the site of the emergency as Owner-directed. Contractor may perform work on a force account basis and will be paid for properly allocated charges which may include labor, bond premium, supplies and materials, equipment and subcontract billings, incurred in the performance of such force account work as more particularly described below:

- A. Labor: All labor shall be billed at the hourly rates specified in the bid. Regular rates will apply during normal business hours, defined as Monday through Friday, 7a.m.–5p.m. Overtime rates will apply during non-normal business hours. If premium rates apply, then overtime rates shall be defined as Monday through Friday, 5p.m.–8p.m. Accordingly, premium rates, if applicable, shall be defined as Monday through Saturday, 8p.m.–7a.m.,

all hours on Sundays and all County recognized holidays. A foreman shall not be used where there are fewer than two (2) laborers employed, except with the written consent of the County. Subsistence and travel allowance where required by collective bargaining agreements shall be included.

The charges for labor shall include all classifications through foremen when engaged in the actual and direct performance of the Work. They shall not include charges for such overhead personnel as assistant superintendents, superintendents, office personnel, timekeepers, and maintenance mechanics.

- B. Bonds and Insurance: For bonds and insurance premiums or increases thereto necessitated by the force account work, Contractor shall receive the actual cost to which no percent shall be added. Contractor shall furnish satisfactory evidence of the rate or rates paid for such bond and insurance.
- C. Materials: For materials accepted by the County and used as an integral part of the finished Work, Contractor shall receive the actual cost of such materials delivered on the Work, including transportation charges paid by him, exclusive of machinery rentals as hereinafter set forth.

If materials are procured by Contractor by a method which is not a direct purchase from and a direct billing by the actual supplier, the cost of such materials shall be deemed to be the lowest current wholesale price at which such materials are available in the quantities concerned and delivered to the site of the Work.

For other materials used in the construction which are not an integral part of the finished Work, such as, but not limited to, sheeting, false work and form lumber, Contractor shall be reimbursed in the amount agreed upon by the County before such work is begun. The salvage value of such material will be taken into consideration in determining the amount of reimbursement.

- D. Equipment: Contractor will be paid for the use of Contractor owned or rented equipment at seventy percent (70%) of the suggested monthly rental rates listed for such equipment in the Blue Book Rental Rates for Construction Equipment (published by Equipment Guide-Book Company of Palo Alto), except as modified below, which edition shall be the latest edition in effect at the time of commencement of the force account work. Hourly rental rates shall be calculated by dividing the listed monthly rates as modified above by 176 hours. The rental rate for equipment used in excess of eight (8) hours per day, shall be at the rate of fifty percent (50%) of the hourly rates as calculated above. The rental rates for standby equipment, when authorized by the County, shall be at the rate of fifty percent (50%) of the hourly rate for equipment in use eight (8) hours per day. No payment of rentals for standby equipment will be made for more than eight (8) hours per working day and no payment will be made for weekend days or holidays. If it is deemed necessary by Contractor to use equipment not listed in the applicable edition of the Blue Book Rental Rates, Contractor shall furnish the necessary cost data and paid invoices to the County for its use in establishment of such rental rate(s). Equipment must be in good operating condition. The rental rates paid as above provided shall include the cost of fuel, oil, lubricants, supplies, small tools, necessary attachments, repairs and maintenance of all kinds, depreciation, storage and insurance. Equipment operators will be paid for as stipulated herein.

The rental time to be paid for equipment on the Work site shall be the time the equipment is required for the force account work being performed. The time shall include the time

required to move the equipment to the location of the force account work and return it to the original location or to another location requiring no more time than that required to return it to its original location. Moving time will not be paid if the equipment is used at the site of the force account work on other than such force account work. Loading and transporting costs will be allowed, in lieu of moving time, when the equipment is moved by means other than its own power. No payment for loading and transporting will be made if the equipment is used at the site of the force account work on other than such force account work. Compensation will not be allowed while equipment is inoperative due to breakdown.

For the use of equipment moved in on the work and used exclusively for work paid for on a force account basis, providing the County has agreed to said move, Contractor will be paid the equipment use rates provided for in this clause, for the cost of transporting the equipment to the location of the work and its return to its original location, and for the cost of loading and unloading the equipment, all in accordance with the following provisions:

1. The cost of transporting equipment shall not exceed the applicable minimum established rates by the State of Georgia Public Service commission.
 2. The equipment use period shall begin at the time the equipment is unloaded at the site of the force account work, shall include each day that the equipment is at the site of the force account work, excluding Saturdays and Sundays and other legal holidays unless the force account work is performed on such days, and shall terminate at the end of the day on which the County instructs Contractor to discontinue the use of such equipment. The maximum time to be paid per day will not exceed eight (8) hours unless the equipment is in operation for a longer time.
- E. Subcontract Work: Where the Change Order applies to work being performed under a subcontract, reimbursement, including the fee for small tools, overhead and profit for the subcontractor's work performed on a force account basis shall be computed in precisely the same manner as if performed by Contractor as indicated herein. One additional allowance of five percent (5%) of the subcontractor's total costs will be granted to Contractor for overhead and profit regardless of the tier of the subcontractor. If the subcontractor elects to contract out change order work to a third (or lower) level contractor or supplier of purchased equipment, he shall not be entitled to fees, overhead or profit for such third (or lower) level work or materials. The County reserves the right to direct the Contractor to contract directly with third (or lower) level subcontractors and suppliers of purchased equipment in order to avoid paying multiple fees, overhead and profit for such third (and lower level) subcontractors and suppliers of purchased equipment. If similar work is not being performed at the Work site, and if required by County, Contractor shall obtain three (3) competitive bids for the requirements of the Change Order and the Contract Documents from Subcontractors acceptable to the County. Selection of the Subcontractor shall be subject to the approval of the County.
- F. Compensation: The compensation as set forth above shall be received by Contractor as payment in full for work done on a force account basis. At the end of each day, Contractor's Representative and Inspector shall compare records of the Work performed including classification of all laborers, ordered on a force account basis.
- G. Statements: No payment will be made for work performed on a force account basis until Contractor furnishes the County itemized statements of the cost of such force account work detailed as to the following:

1. Labor - name, classification, date, daily hours, total hours, rate, and extension of each laborer and foreman.
 2. Equipment - size, type, identification number, dates, daily hours, total hours, rental rate, and extension of each unit of machinery and equipment.
 3. Materials - quantities of supplies and materials, prices, including transportation cost and extensions.
 4. Bonds and insurance premiums.
 5. Subcontract work - force account detail as above, or progress quantities and prices of unit price or lump sum subcontracts.
 6. Payments for items under paragraphs (a) to (f) inclusive shall be conditioned upon Contractor's presentation of original receipted invoices for materials used and transportation charges. If, however, the materials used in the force account work are not specially purchased for such work but are taken from Contractor's stock, then in lieu of the original invoices, the statements shall contain or be accompanied by an affidavit of Contractor which shall certify that such materials were taken from his stock, that the price and transportation of the material as claimed represent actual cost.
- H. If, in the County's opinion, Contractor or any of his subcontractors, in performing force account work, are not making efficient use of labor, material, or equipment and/or are proceeding in a manner which is expensive to the County, the County may request the Contractor to make more efficient use of labor, material and equipment. Contractor shall in good faith comply with such requests as are reasonable. If the Contractor fails to comply with such requests, the County may independently determine the reasonable cost of the work and the Contractor will be entitled only to the reasonable cost so estimated by the County.

GC-90 DISAGREEMENT WITH ORDERS FOR CHANGE

Contractor's written acceptance of a Change Order or other order for changes shall constitute his final and binding agreement to the provisions thereof and a waiver of all claims in connection therewith, whether direct or consequential in nature. Should Contractor disagree with any order for changes, he may submit a notice of potential claim to the County, at such time as the order is set forth in the form of a Change Order. Disagreement with the provisions of an order for changes shall not relieve Contractor of his obligation under Clause GC-88, Change Orders.

GC-91 CHANGED CONDITIONS

Contractor shall notify the County in writing of the following conditions, hereinafter called "changed conditions," promptly upon their discovery and before they are disturbed:

- A. Subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site of Work differing materially from those represented in this Contract; or
- B. Unknown physical conditions at the Site of the Work of an unusual nature differing materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of the character provided for in this Contract.

The County will promptly investigate conditions of which it is so notified or conditions discovered by it which appear to be changed conditions, and will, as soon as practicable, issue appropriate orders or instructions. If the County determines that the conditions materially differ and that they will materially increase or decrease the costs of any portion of Work, it will issue a Change Order adjusting the compensation for such portion of Work.

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VENDOR INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance:

Contractor shall provide evidence of insurance for at least the coverage and amounts set forth below. All insurance shall be maintained in the form and with a company (or companies) satisfactory to the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners. The Contractor and their Subcontractor's/vendor's Certificates of Insurance shall require that the County be notified in writing thirty (30) days prior to cancellation, modification, or non-renewal of any insurance policy listed on the certificate(s). Upon request, the County will be provided certified copies of all required insurance policies.

The Contractor awarded work under this contract shall commence work within ten (10) days after the issuance of the Notice to Proceed and should fully complete all work hereunder by October 17, 2026.

The County shall pay and the Contractor shall receive the prices stipulated in the proposal hereto attached as full compensation for everything furnished and done by the Contractor under this contract, which shall in no event exceed (\$ _____) based on the proposal which sum shall be paid in the manner and terms specified in the Contract Documents, but before issuance of certificate of payment, if the Contractor shall not have submitted evidence satisfactory to the County that all payrolls, materials bills, and other indebtedness connected with the work have been paid, the County may withhold, in addition to the retained percentages, such amount or amounts as may be necessary to pay just claims for labor and services rendered and materials in and about the work, and such amount or amounts withheld or retained may be applied by the County to the payment of such just claims.

When the Contractor has performed in accordance with the provisions of this Contract, Gwinnett County shall pay to the Contractor, within thirty (30) days of receipt of any payment request based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the Contract, the sum so requested, less the retainage stated in this Contract, if any. In the event that Gwinnett County fails to pay the Contractor within sixty (60) days of receipt of a pay request based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the Contract, the County shall pay the Contractor interest at the rate of 1/2% per month or pro rata fraction thereof, beginning the sixty-first (61st) day following receipt of the pay request. The Contractor's acceptance of progress payments or final payment shall release all claims for interest on said payments.

It is further mutually agreed between the Parties hereto that if, at any time after the execution of the Contract and the Performance Bond for its faithful performance and the Payment Bond, the first party shall deem the surety or sureties upon such bond to be inadequate to cover the

I. PREPARATION OF SUBMITTAL

- A. Each vendor shall examine the drawings, specifications, schedule, and all instructions. Failure to do so will be at the vendor's risk, as the vendor will be held accountable for their submittal.
- B. Each vendor shall furnish all information required by the solicitation form or document. Each vendor shall sign the submittal and print or type his or her name on the fee schedule. The person signing the submittal should initial erasures or other changes. An authorized agent of the vendor must sign the submittal.
- C. Fee schedule pricing should have only two decimal places unless otherwise stated. In the event of a calculation error in total price, the unit pricing prevails.
- D. Except for solicitations for the sale of real property, individuals, firms, and businesses seeking an award of a Gwinnett County contract may not initiate or continue any verbal or written communications regarding a solicitation with any County officer, elected official, employee, or other County representative other than the Purchasing Associate named in the solicitation between the date of the issuance of the solicitation and the date of the final award. The Purchasing Director will review violations. If determined that such communication has compromised the competitive process, the offer submitted by the individual, firm or business may be disqualified from consideration for award. Solicitations for the sale of real property may allow for verbal or written communications with the appropriate Gwinnett County representative.
- E. Sample contracts (if pertinent) are attached. These do NOT have to be filled out with the submittal but are contained for informational purposes only. If awarded, the successful vendor(s) will be required to execute these documents prior to County execution.
- F. Effective July 1, 2013 and in accordance with the Georgia Illegal Immigration Reform Enhancements for 2013, an original signed, notarized and fully completed Contractor Affidavit and Agreement should be included with vendor's submittal, if the solicitation is for the physical performance of services for all labor or service contract(s) that exceed \$2,499.99 (except for services performed by an individual who is licensed pursuant to Title 26, Title 43, or the State Bar of Georgia). Failure to provide the Contractor Affidavit and Agreement with your submittal may result in being deemed non-responsive and automatic rejection.

II. DELIVERY

- A. Each vendor should state time of proposed delivery of goods or services.
- B. Words such as "immediate," "as soon as possible," etc. should not be used. The known earliest date or the minimum number of calendar days required after receipt of order (delivery A.R.O.) should be stated. If calendar days are used, include Saturday, Sunday, and holidays in the number.

III. EXPLANATION TO VENDORS

Any explanation desired by a vendor regarding the meaning or interpretation of the solicitation, drawings, specifications, etc. must be requested by the question cutoff deadline stated in the solicitation for a reply to reach all vendors before the deadline of the solicitation. Any information given to a prospective vendor concerning a solicitation

will be furnished to all prospective vendors as an addendum to the solicitation if such information is necessary or if the lack of such information would be prejudicial to uninformed vendors. The written solicitation documents supersede any verbal or written communications between the parties. Receipt of addenda should be acknowledged in the submittal. **It is the vendor's responsibility to ensure they have all applicable addenda prior to their submittal.** This may be accomplished by contacting the assigned Purchasing Associate prior to the submittal or visiting the Gwinnett County website.

IV. SUBMISSION OF FORMAL OFFERS/SUBMITTALS

- A. Formal bid and proposal submittals shall be enclosed in a sealed package or envelope, addressed to the Gwinnett County Purchasing Division with the name of the vendor, the date and hour of opening and the solicitation number on the face of the package or envelope. Facsimile or emailed submittals will not be considered. Any addenda should be enclosed in the sealed envelopes as well.
- B. ADD/DEDUCT: Add or deduct amounts indicated on the outside of the envelope are allowed and will be applied to the lump sum amount. Amount shall be clearly stated and should be initialed by an authorized representative.
- C. Samples of items, when required, must be submitted within the time specified and, unless otherwise specified by the County, at no expense to the County. Unless otherwise specified, samples will be returned at the vendor's request and expense, if items are not destroyed by testing.
- D. Items offered must meet required specifications and must be of a quality that will adequately serve the use and purpose for which intended.
- E. Full identification of each item submitted, including brand name, model, catalog number, etc. must be furnished to identify exactly what the vendor is offering. Manufacturer's literature may be furnished but vendor should not submit excessive marketing material.
- F. The vendor must certify that items to be furnished are new and that the quality has not deteriorated to impair its usefulness.
- G. Unsigned submittals will not be considered except in cases where it is enclosed with other documents that have been signed. The County will determine acceptability in these cases.
- H. Gwinnett County is exempt from federal excise tax and Georgia sales tax regarding goods and services purchased directly by Gwinnett County. Vendors are responsible for federal excise tax and sales tax, including taxes for materials incorporated in county construction projects. Vendors should contact the State of Georgia Sales Tax Division for additional information. Agreements where there is a cost-plus mark-up, mark-up will not be paid on taxes.
- I. Information submitted by a vendor in the solicitation process shall be subject to disclosure after the public opening in accordance with the Georgia Open Records Act.

V. WITHDRAWAL DUE TO ERRORS

Vendors must give Gwinnett County Purchasing Division written notice within two (2) business days of completion of the opening stating that they wish to withdraw their submittal without penalty for an obvious clerical or calculation error. Submittal may be withdrawn from consideration if the price was substantially lower than the other submittals due solely to a mistake therein, provided pricing was submitted in good faith, and the mistake was a clerical mistake as opposed to a judgment mistake and was due to an unintentional arithmetic error or an unintentional omission of a quantity of work, labor or material made directly in the compilation of the submittal. The unintentional arithmetic error or omission can be clearly proven through inspection of the original work papers, documents, and materials used in preparing the submittal sought to be withdrawn. The vendor's original work papers shall be the sole acceptable evidence of error and mistake if a vendor elects to withdraw their submittal. If a quote or bid submittal is withdrawn under the authority of this provision, the lowest remaining responsive offer shall be deemed to be low bid.

No vendor who is permitted to withdraw their submittal shall, for compensation, supply any material or labor or perform any subcontract or other work agreement for the person or firm to whom the contract is awarded or otherwise benefit, directly or indirectly, from the performance of the project for which the withdrawn bid or proposal was submitted.

Vendors who fail to request withdrawal by the required forty-eight (48) hours may automatically forfeit bid bond if a bond was required. Bid may not be withdrawn otherwise.

Withdrawal is not automatically granted and will be allowed solely at Gwinnett County's discretion.

VI. TESTING AND INSPECTION

Since tests may require several days for completion, the County reserves the right to use a portion of any supplies before the results of the tests are determined. Cost of inspections and tests of any item that fails to meet the specifications, shall be borne by the vendor.

VII. F.O.B. POINT

Unless otherwise stated in the request for invitation and any resulting contract, or unless qualified by the vendor, items shall be shipped F.O.B. Destination, Freight Prepaid and Allowed. The seller shall retain title for the risk of transportation, including the filing for loss or damages. The invoice covering the items is not payable until items are delivered and the contract of carriage has been completed. Unless the F.O.B. clause states otherwise, the seller assumes transportation and related charges either by payment or allowance.

VIII. PATENT INDEMNITY

The vendor guarantees to hold the County, its agents, officers, or employees harmless from liability of any nature or kind for use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted composition, secret process, patented or unpatented invention, articles or appliances furnished or used in the performance of the contract, for which the vendor is not the patentee, assignee, or licensee.

IX. BID BONDS AND PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BONDS (IF REQUIRED, FORMS WILL BE PROVIDED IN THIS DOCUMENT)

A five percent (5%) bid bond, a one hundred percent (100%) performance bond, and a one hundred percent (100%) payment bond must be furnished to Gwinnett County for any solicitation as required in the solicitation package or document. **Failure to submit a bid bond with the proper rating will result in submittal being deemed non-responsive.** Bonding company must be authorized to do business in Georgia by the Georgia Insurance Commission, listed in the Department of the Treasury's publication of companies holding certificates of authority as acceptable surety on Federal bonds and as acceptable reinsuring companies, and have an A.M. Best rating as stated in the insurance requirement of the solicitation. **The bid bond, payment bond, and performance bond must have the proper A.M. Best rating as stated in the solicitation document.**

X. DISCOUNTS

- A. Time payment discounts may be considered in arriving at net prices and in award of solicitations. Offers of discounts for payment within ten (10) days following the end of the month are preferred.
- B. In connection with any discount offered, time will be computed from the date of delivery and acceptance at destination, or from the date correct invoice or voucher is received, whichever is the later date. Payment is deemed to be made for the purpose of earning the discount on the date of the County check.

XI. AWARD

- A. Award will be made to either the highest scoring firm (for proposals) or the lowest responsive and responsible vendor (for quotes/bids). The quality of the articles to be supplied, their conformity with the specifications, their suitability to the requirements of the County, and the delivery terms will be taken into consideration in making the award. The County may make such investigations as it deems necessary to determine the ability of the vendor to perform, and the vendor shall furnish to the County all such information and data for this purpose as the County may request. The County reserves the right to reject any submittal if the evidence submitted by, or investigation of such vendor fails to satisfy the County that such vendor is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract.
- B. The County reserves the right to reject or accept any or all offers and to waive technicalities, informalities and minor irregularities in the submittals received.
- C. The County reserves the right to make an award as deemed in its best interest, which may include awarding to a single vendor or multiple vendors; or to award the whole solicitation agreement, only part of the agreement, or none of the agreement, based on its sole discretion of its best interest.
- D. In the event of proposal scores rounded to the nearest whole number result in a tie score, the award will be based on lowest cost.
- E. If proposal negotiations with the highest ranked firm are unsuccessful, the County may then negotiate with the second ranked firm and so on until a satisfactory agreement has been reached.

XII. DELIVERY FAILURES

Failure of a vendor to deliver within the time specified or within reasonable time as interpreted by the Purchasing Director, or failure to make replacement of rejected articles/services when so requested, immediately or as directed by the Purchasing

Director, shall constitute authority for the Purchasing Director to purchase in the open market articles/services of comparable grade to replace the articles/services rejected or not delivered. On all such purchases, the vendor shall reimburse the County within a reasonable time specified by the Purchasing Director for any expense incurred in excess of the contract prices, or the County shall have the right to deduct such amount from monies owed the defaulting vendor. Alternatively, the County may penalize the vendor one percent (1%) per day for a period of up to ten (10) days for each day that delivery or replacement is late. Should public necessity demand it, the County reserves the right to use or consume articles/services delivered which are substandard in quality, subject to an adjustment in price to be determined by the Purchasing Director.

XIII. COUNTY FURNISHED PROPERTY

No material, labor or facilities will be furnished by the County unless so provided in the solicitation package.

XIV. REJECTION OF SUBMITTALS

Failure to observe any of the instructions or conditions in this solicitation package may constitute grounds for rejection.

XV. CONTRACT

Each submittal is received with the understanding that the acceptance in writing by the County of the offer to furnish any or all the commodities or services described therein shall constitute a contract between the vendor and the County which shall bind the vendor on his part to furnish and deliver the articles quoted at the prices stated in accordance with the conditions of said accepted submittal. The County, on its part, may order from such vendor, except for cause beyond reasonable control, and to pay for, at the agreed prices, all articles specified and delivered.

Upon receipt of a solicitation package containing a Gwinnett County "Sample Contract" as part of the requirements, it is understood that the vendor has reviewed the documents with the understanding that Gwinnett County requires that all agreements between the parties must be entered into via this document. If any exceptions are taken to any part, each must be stated in detail and submitted as part of the vendor's submittal. If no exceptions are stated, it is assumed that the vendor fully agrees to the provisions contained in the "Sample Contract" in its entirety.

Any Consultant as defined in O.C.G.A. §36-80-28 that is engaged to develop or draft specifications/requirements or serve in a consultative role during the procurement process for any County procurement method, by entering into such an arrangement or executing a contract, the consultant agrees to abide by the current state law and: 1) Avoid any appearance of impropriety and shall follow all policies and procedures of the County, 2) Disclose to the County any material transaction or relationship pursuant to §36-80-28, that is considered a conflict of interest, any involvement in litigation or other dispute, relationship, or financial interest not disclosed in the ethics affidavit, and 3) Acknowledge that any violation or threatened violation of the agreement may cause irreparable injury to the County, entitling the County to seek injunctive relief in addition to all other legal remedies.

When the vendor has performed in accordance with the provisions of this agreement, Gwinnett County shall pay to the vendor, within thirty (30) days of receipt of any department approved payment request and based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the contract, the sum so requested, less the retainage stated in this

agreement, if any. If Gwinnett County fails to pay the vendor within sixty (60) days of receipt of a pay request based upon work completed or service provided pursuant to the contract, the County shall pay the vendor interest at the rate of ½% per month or pro rata fraction thereof, beginning the sixty-first (61st) day following receipt of pay requests. The vendor's acceptance of progress payments or final payment shall release all claims for interest on said payment.

The parties agree that this Contract shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Georgia.

XVI. NON-COLLUSION

Vendor declares that the submittal is not made in connection with any other vendor's submittal for the same commodity or commodities, and that the submittal is bona fide and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud. An affidavit of non-collusion shall be executed by each vendor. Collusion and fraud in submittal preparation shall be reported to the State of Georgia Attorney General and the United States Justice Department.

XVII. DEFAULT

The contract may be canceled or annulled by the Purchasing Director in whole or in part by written notice of default to the vendor upon non-performance or violation of contract terms. An award may be made to the next low responsive and responsible vendor, or the next highest scoring responsive and responsible proposer, or articles specified may be purchased on the open market similar to those so terminated. In either event, the defaulting vendor (or their surety) shall be liable to the County for costs to the County in excess of the defaulted contract prices; provided, however, that the vendor shall continue the performance of this contract to the extent not terminated under the provisions of this clause. Failure of the vendor to deliver materials or services within the time stipulated on their offer, unless extended in writing by the Purchasing Director, shall constitute contract default.

XVIII. TERMINATION FOR CAUSE

The County may terminate this agreement for cause upon ten days prior written notice to the vendor of the vendor's default in the performance of any term of this agreement. Such termination shall be without prejudice to any of the County's rights or remedies by law.

XIX. TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE

The County may terminate this agreement for its convenience at any time upon 30 days written notice to the vendor. In the event of the County's termination of this agreement for convenience, the vendor will be paid for those services actually performed. Partially completed performance of the agreement will be compensated based upon a signed statement of completion to be submitted by the vendor, which shall itemize each element of performance.

XX. SUBSTITUTIONS

Vendors offering substitutions or who are deviating from the attached specifications shall list such deviations on a separate sheet to be submitted with their offer. The absence of such a substitution list shall indicate that the vendor has taken no exception to the specifications contained herein.

XXI. INELIGIBLE VENDORS

The County may choose not to accept the offer by an individual, firm, or business who is in default on the payment of taxes, licenses, or other monies owed to the County. Additionally, vendors or persons placed on an Ineligible Source List for reasons listed in Part 6, Section II of the Gwinnett County Purchasing Ordinance shall not be eligible to provide any commodities or services to the County during the period such person remains on the Ineligible Source List.

XXII. PENDING LITIGATION

An individual, firm, or business that has litigation pending against the County, or anyone representing a firm or business in litigation against the County, not arising out of the procurement process, will be disqualified.

XXIII. OCCUPATION TAX CERTIFICATE

Each successful vendor must have a valid Gwinnett County occupation tax certificate if the vendor maintains an office within the unincorporated area of Gwinnett County. Incorporated, out of County, and out of State vendors are required to have any and all certificates necessary to do business in any town, County or municipality in the State of Georgia, or as otherwise required by County ordinance or resolution. Vendors may be required to provide evidence of valid certificates. Out of State vendors are required to have a certificate in the Georgia jurisdiction where they receive the most revenue.

XXIV. PURCHASING POLICY AND REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Purchasing Policy & Review Committee has been established to review purchasing procedures and make recommendations for changes; resolve problems regarding the purchasing process; make recommendations for standardization of commodities, schedule buying, qualified products list, annual contracts, supplier performance (Ineligible Source List), and other problems or requirements related to purchasing. The Purchasing Policy & Review Committee has authority to place vendors on the Ineligible Source List for reasons listed in Part 6, Section II of the Gwinnett County Purchasing Ordinance, for a period not to exceed three (3) years.

XXV. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

All vendors for Gwinnett County are required to comply with all applicable sections of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) as an equal opportunity employer. In compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Gwinnett County provides reasonable accommodations to permit a qualified applicant with a disability to enjoy the privileges of employment equal to those employees without disabilities. Disabled individuals must satisfy job requirements for education background, employment experience, and must be able to perform those tasks that are essential to the job with or without reasonable accommodations. Any requests for the reasonable accommodations required by individuals to fully participate in any open meeting, program or activity of Gwinnett County should be directed to the ADA Coordinator, 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30046, 770-822-8165.

XXVI. ALTERATIONS OF SOLICITATION AND ASSOCIATED DOCUMENTS

Alterations of County documents are strictly prohibited and will result in automatic disqualification of the vendor's solicitation response. If there are "exceptions" or comments to any of the solicitation requirements or other language, then the firm may make notes to those areas, but may not materially alter any document language.

XXVII. TAX LIABILITY

Local and state governmental entities must notify vendors of their use tax liability on public works projects. Under Georgia law, private vendors are responsible for paying a use tax equal to the sales tax rate on material and equipment purchased under a governmental exemption that is incorporated into a government construction project: excluding material and equipment provided for the installation, repair, or expansion of a public water, gas, or sewer system when the property is installed for general distribution purposes. To the extent the tangible personal property maintains its character (for example, the installation of a kitchen stove), it remains tax-exempt. However, if the installation incorporates the tangible personal property into realty (for example, the installation of sheetrock), it becomes taxable to the private vendor. See O.C.G.A. §48-8-3(2) and O.C.G.A. §48-8-63.

XXVIII. STATE AND FEDERAL LAW REGARDING WORKER VERIFICATION

Effective July 1, 2013 State Law requires that all who enter into a contract for the physical performance of services for all labor or service contract(s) that exceed \$2,499.99 (except for services performed by an individual who is licensed pursuant to Title 26, Title 43, or the State Bar of Georgia) and that all who enter into a contract for public works as defined by O.C.G.A. §36-91-2(12) for the County, must satisfy the Illegal Immigration Reform Enhancements for 2013 in conjunction with the Federal Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA) of 1986, in all manner, and such are conditions of the contract.

The Purchasing Division Director with the assistance of the Internal Audit Division shall be authorized to conduct random audits of a vendor's or subcontractors' compliance with the Illegal Immigration Reform Enhancements for 2013 and the rules and regulations of the Georgia Department of Labor. The vendor and subcontractors shall retain all documents and records of its compliance for a period of five (5) years following completion of the contract or shall abide by the current time requirements at the time of the contract. This requirement shall apply to all contracts for all public works, labor or service contracts that exceed \$2,499.99 except for services performed by an individual who is licensed pursuant to Title 26, Title 43, or the State Bar of Georgia.

Whenever it appears that a vendor's or subcontractor's records are not sufficient to verify the work eligibility of any individual in the employment of such vendor or subcontractor, the Purchasing Director shall report same to the Department of Homeland Security and may result in termination of the contract if it is determined at any time during the work that the vendor or subcontractor is no longer in compliance with worker verification.

By submitting an offer to the County, vendor agrees that, in the event the vendor employs or contracts with any subcontractor(s) in connection with the covered contract, the vendor will secure from the subcontractor(s) such subcontractor(s)' indication of the employee-number category applicable to the subcontractor, as well as attestation(s) from such subcontractor(s) that they follow the Illegal Immigration Reform Enhancements for 2013 in conjunction with all federal requirements. Original signed, notarized Subcontractor Affidavits and Agreements must be maintained by the vendor awarded the contract.

A vendor's or subcontractor's failure to participate in the federal work authorization program as defined above shall be subject to termination of the contract. A vendor's failure to follow Gwinnett County's instruction to terminate a subcontractor that is not participating in the federal work authorization program may be subject to termination of the contract.

XXIX. SOLID WASTE ORDINANCE

No individual, partnership, corporation, or other entity shall engage in solid waste handling except in such a manner as to conform to and comply with the current Gwinnett County Solid Waste Ordinance and all other applicable local, state and federal legislation, rules, regulation, and orders.

XXX. GENERAL CONTRACTORS LICENSE

Effective July 1, 2008: All General Contractors must have a current valid license from the State Licensing Board for Residential and General Contractors, unless specifically exempted from holding such license pursuant to Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §43-41-17).

XXXI. PRODUCTS MANUFACTURED IN GEORGIA

When contracting for or purchasing supplies, materials, equipment, or agricultural products that exceeds \$100,000.00, excluding beverages for immediate consumption, Gwinnett County shall give preference as far as may be reasonable and practicable to such supplies, materials, equipment, and agricultural products as may be manufactured or produced in this state. Such preference shall not sacrifice quality. Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners shall consider, among other factors, information submitted by the vendor which may include the vendor's estimate of the multiplier effect on gross state domestic product and the effect on public revenues of the state and the effect on public revenues of political subdivisions resulting from acceptance of an offer to sell Georgia manufactured or produced goods as opposed to out-of-state manufactured or produced goods. Any such estimates shall be in writing. (O.C.G.A. §36-84-1).

XXXII. INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the vendor shall, at his sole cost and expense, indemnify, defend, satisfy all judgments, and hold harmless the County, its commissioners, officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, damages, actions, judgments, costs, penalties, liabilities, losses and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work, provided that any such claim, damage, action, judgment, cost, penalty, liability, loss or expense (1) is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the work itself) including the loss of use resulting therefrom, and (2) is caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts, errors by any act or omission of the vendor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless whether such claim is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any of the rights or obligations of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this agreement. In any and all claims against the County, its commissioners, officers, agents, and employees by any employee of the vendor, any subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation contained herein shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the vendor or any subcontractor under Worker's Compensation Acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

Vendor shall also indemnify, hold harmless, insure, and defend the County for damages, losses, or expenses to the extent caused by or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, or intentionally wrongful conduct of the vendor or other persons employed or utilized by the vendor in the performance of a contract that utilizes survey services.

XXXIII. CODE OF ETHICS

Vendors shall disclose under oath the name of all elected officials whom it employs or who have a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in the business entity, its affiliates, or its subcontractors. (This shall not apply to informal purchases as defined by the Purchasing Ordinance.) The vendor shall execute a Code of Ethics affidavit. Failure to submit the affidavit during the procurement process shall render the offer non-responsive.

Any business entity holding a contract with Gwinnett County that after execution of the contract or issuance of the purchase order employs, subcontracts with, or transfers a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in the business entity to an elected official shall within five (5) days disclose such fact in writing under oath to the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners. Failure to comply, or vendors submitting false information or omitting material information shall be referred to the Purchasing Policy & Review Committee for action pursuant to the Purchasing Ordinance or to the District Attorney for possible criminal prosecution. XXXIV. ELECTRONIC PAYMENT
